GCSE GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK 8TH AND 9TH SEPTEMBER 2016

A decision-making exercise about the impact of tourism at Box Hill, Surrey



As you will no doubt be aware, fieldwork and investigation forms a core part of the GCSE Geography course. As part of the Controlled Assessment unit of the course (which makes up 25% of the total marks) students are required to conduct research and a full day's fieldwork.

Box Hill in Surrey is somewhere that many of you may have already been to. As a popular tourist location near to London, it was made more famous by Mark Cavendish and co as they passed through the area during the London Olympics cycling road race. Box Hill is an "Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty" and a "Site of Special Scientific Interest", resulting in constant conflict between conservationists, tourists and local businesses making it a perfect location for geographers to study.

During their Geography controlled assessment task, students will conduct research and produce a 2000 word report that will "Investigate the contrasting pressures affecting a rural area". Our proposed title will be "Is Box Hill a victim of its own success?"

To aid in the production of the report, students will base their research on the following three sub-questions:

- 1. What attracts tourists to Box Hill?
- 2. What environmental impacts do tourists have on Box Hill?
- 3. How successful is Box Hill in managing these environmental impacts?

Initial preparation for the task will be started in lessons between now and the end of Year 10. Students will then be expected to complete some additional research (secondary data collection) over the summer holiday. The fieldwork (primary data collection) will then be conducted on either 8th or 9th September 2016. (We have to split the group into two halves due to maximum numbers that can be accommodated at Box Hill on any one day). Groups for each day will be decided and communicated before the end of the summer term.

Itinerary:

Meet by the main entrance to school at 7:15am, outside reception, in smart/casual clothes, for a 7:30am departure. We will be taking a coach from Furze Platt directly to Box Hill.

Your son/daughter needs to arrive at school at 7:15am for a 7:30am departure and will be returning at 4:30pm.

Students will not be required to wear school uniform, however are expected to uphold their appearance and school ethos by wearing appropriate clothing on the trip. This includes sturdy shoes (there will be walking to do) and a warm/rain coat (weather dependent).

Students will also need to bring a packed lunch, snacks and a refillable water bottle to sustain them throughout the day. There will be limited opportunities to get food at the site.

In order for this to go ahead we require a contribution of £20 which will include all coach travel and entrance fee plus any other costs. We do feel it is important that your son/daughter attends the day.



YEAR 8 SCIENCE: END OF KS3 EXAMS



During week beginning 4th July Year 8 will complete their End of KS3 Science Examinations.

As such, students should be looking to revise the subject matter from both Year 7 and Year 8, covering the Key Stage 3 curriculum.

Revision can be conducted online using BBC Bitesize and Doddlelearn, but it would be beneficial to purchase (at face value) the KS3 revision guide. These will be available from the Science Prep Room during school for £5 on a first-come, first-served basis.



PRE-PUBLIC EXAMS



The Pre-Public Exams (PPEs) will take place from Wednesday 29th June to Tuesday 5th July. They take place during the normal school day, and students will be expected to be in lessons if they do not have an exam. As with previous years, there is, therefore, no 'study leave' for PPEs and students will be in school from 8.45am to 3.15pm as usual. However, when students have afternoon exams they will be permitted to leave after the exam finishes. Please note that, while some exams will finish before 3.15pm, there are some subjects that will not finish until 3.30pm.

During the exams Year 10 will have their Break 2 at an earlier time than usual. This will run from 12.45pm to 1.15pm. They will then start their afternoon exam after that.

Details of timings are on the letter below. Students will receive individual timetables which will have details of their seating and specific exam times.

Please may I ask you to work with your son/daughter to ensure that they prepare appropriately for the PPEs. They should be following a revision timetable and working steadily and sustainably towards the exams. PPEs are essential preparation for the final GCSE examinations next summer.

PPE results will be given to students on Friday 15th July.
