ROYAL HOLLOWAY UNIVERSITY OF LONDON PSYCHOLOGY RESEARCH AT FURZE PLATT SENIOR SCHOOL



Our Psychology teachers are closely co-operating with a local university, Royal Holloway University of London. This relationship helps our students become involved in higher level Psychology and research. Currently, the university is carrying out research into children's perception and we have been invited to give our students a chance to take part in this research. This is a really exciting opportunity for the Psychology department. Next week a random selection of Year 7 and 8 students will be taken out of their lessons for a maximum of 15-20 minutes to complete a short perception task supervised by the Royal Holloway researchers. We will liaise with subject teachers to ensure that any disruption to learning is minimised. We would also like to assure you that students' personal details will be kept confidential, as well as the individual results from each student.

There will be an opportunity to learn about the results of the study in October when the researchers will visit our school again to hold a seminar for our Sixth Form Psychology students. UNIVERSITIES TRIPS INFORMATION



Sussex – students must be at school by 7.45am.

Oxford Brookes –meet outside Reception at 8.45 (no tutor time)

Royal Holloway – go to tutor time and meet outside Reception at 9.00

Oxford Brookes, Holloway and Reading students should all be back by 3.15pm. If they get back shortly before 3.15, students will go home early.

Sussex students should be back by 4pm.

Uniform

Students must wear full uniform. The day will involve walking around the campus, outside, so if it is wet they should bring a coat/umbrella.

Mobile Phones

At the university, exactly the same rules about mobile phones will apply as at school. They must not be seen or heard.

Medical

Any student who carries an asthma inhaler, any medication, etc. must remember to bring it with them.

Lunch

At Sussex and Holloway, students will be able to buy food from the university cafes or shops, so can either bring money for this or they should bring a packed lunch.

Those going to Oxford Brookes need to bring a packed lunch as they will not be able to buy any food there.

At Reading, students can buy food there, but the university has warned us that the food outlets are likely to be very busy and if students decide to buy food they might spend all their lunch break queueing. They may prefer to bring food with them.

Bring plenty of water to drink, especially if the weather is hot.

Chloe Smith (Year 12) has been selected as one of 20 ambassadors to participate in an HET project in Israel this summer. She applied after completing the Lessons from Auschwitz project. Please see her summary below:

I will be going to Israel from the 7th to the 16th August with twenty other ambassadors from across the country. The aim of the visit is to further my knowledge about the holocaust, a subject I'm very passionate about. I will be taking part in lectures and workshops led by world-renowned experts in Holocaust Studies at the Yad Vashem Holocaust museum. This is an incredible opportunity as I will be learning about the history of anti-antisemitism and also the relevance the holocaust still has today. Israel is the centre of Jewish culture so a majority of all holocaust research takes place there. I am looking forward to learning in an alternative environment with other like minded people. We will be staying in Jerusalem but will also be taking excursions to visit the old city of Jerusalem and the ancient fortress of Masada to learn about Jewish culture and history. This is something I believe to be so important as many people do not know much about the rich history of the Jews and their contribution to the society we live in. Our group will also visit the vibrant city of Tel Aviv as a break from the intense week of learning and researching. I hope I can take away knowledge about the holocaust that isn't as readily available in books or the internet and this will help me to develop my role as an ambassador as I can share my experience with other members in our school community.
