PRIME MINISTER VISITS FURZE PLATT SENIOR SCHOOL



The Rt Hon Theresa May, Prime Minister, attended Furze Platt Senior School's Debate Club on Friday 4th November.

During the student-led debate, the Prime Minister answered questions on a number of subjects including Brexit, grammar schools, the Heathrow expansion and the environment.

After a 10 minute introduction by Mrs May, there followed a 45 minute Q&A session in which students from all year groups had taken part in a ballot to attend.

Hosted and organised by Patrick Ashe and Sam MacGregor (both Year 13), the event was attended by over 100 students and staff. Patrick and Sam had first contacted Mrs May over a year ago to invite her to the event. Both boys have a keen interest in politics and are hoping to further study political subjects at university. Patrick said: 'It was very interesting to hear how the Prime Minister discussed big issues in an accessible way.'

The Prime Minister said: 'I was delighted to take part in today's discussion at Furze Platt Senior School. Students of all ages asked a range of questions and it was clear they were extremely engaged in politics and current affairs and had strong views on the issues we face. It was a very lively and engaging debate.'

CAREERS AND HIGHER EDUCATION FAIR

Thursday 24th November 2016, 6pm - 8pm



This year's Careers and Higher Education Fair, for students in Years 9 to 13 and their parents, will be on Thursday 24th November from 6-8pm. Representatives from over 20 universities will be here, including from Oxford and Cambridge, plus approximately 40 different employers or organisations showcasing a wide variety of careers. In addition to our regular participants, there will be a range of exciting new careers on show here this year including IT/computing (Microsoft), health and leisure (David Lloyd club), drama, law (an education lawyer and a barrister), finance (accountancy, banking and private equity), surveying, and more.

As well as the university and careers stalls there will also be talks taking place over the evening, including new ones for this year – examples include careers in IT and Computing (by Microsoft) and the benefits of volunteering/taking a gap year.

A copy of the final programme will be published here nearer the time. It promises to be a very good event.



I would like to invite you to an informational session about a potential two week expedition to Indonesia in summer 2018 to help with biodiversity surveys run by Operation Wallacea. The presentation will be given on Tuesday 8th November at 6.00pm in the Main Hall and is open to Year 11 and 12, but any student interested in biology, ecology and conservation is welcome to attend.

For their first week, students will be based in the endemic-rich rainforests of Buton Island in South-East Sulawesi. Here they will help scientists and academics collect data on biodiversity, which will be used to measure how well the forests are being protected under their proposed conservation management strategies. They will complete jungle survival skills training and help take part in various surveys such as forest measurement (to quantify the amount of carbon stored), butterfly surveys, bird point count surveys, herpetofauna surveys (conducting both pit line surveys and spotlight searches), large mammal and bird surveys (looking for macaques, hornbills, anoa and wild pig) and bat surveys. They will also complete a course on the Ecology of the Wallacea Forests and have the chance to learn how to access the canopy with a half day training course from the Canopy Access Ltd team.

For the second week the group will be based in either Bau Bau or Hoga. This is at the centre of the Coral Triangle – the most diverse reef systems in the world. Here they will learn to dive to PADI Open Water level, or if they are already divetrained or just wish to snorkel, complete an Indo Pacific reef ecology course. The reef ecology course will cover the importance of the marine environment, along with underwater.

It is also possible to use the expedition to gain extra UCAS points by doing an EPQ, and the expedition covers key aspects of biology and geography syllabuses. In addition, if they are applying for UK universities then they automatically qualify by completing the expedition for a University Award that can be included on their UCAS form.

We estimate the total cost of the expedition to be approximately £2770. This price includes participation in the Operation Wallacea programme, flights, internal travel, park fees, reef fees, PADI Manual and dive hire.

Operation Wallacea have a professional fundraising team who can visit and help the school group raise a substantial proportion of the total sum needed.

We look forward to seeing you on the evening.

VISIT TO WWI BATTLEFIELDS IN FRANCE AND BELGIUM

19thJuly - 23rd July 2017

Some places are now available for the annual Years 9 and 10 visit to France and Belgium. During this exciting trip, we will visit the First World War battlefields in Ypres (Belgium) and the Somme (France), and take part in the famous Last Post commemorations. We will also have lots of opportunities to practise our French, including during a town trail at St Omer and while visiting a market at Desvres. We will enjoy learning about the life cycle of the snail at L'Esgargoterie de Choquel, before devouring some of the slimy delicacies (purely optional, but most students do choose to!), and will also try our hand at making sweets at Besouac sweet factory. The trip is particularly suitable for GCSE French and History students in both Years 9 and 10, but is open to those not studying these subjects too. The cost of £395 covers just about everything, including food, travel and accommodation in a nice hotel outside Ypres. The only things not covered by the cost are presents for parents (Belgian chocolate is a favourite; waffles don't travel so well). Although the closing date is Friday 15th November, this trip is always popular and places will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.
