#### MAYOR PRESENTS CERTIFICATES TO 'EXCEPTIONAL' YEAR OF STUDENTS


'A graduation ceremony to celebrate the 'exceptional' contribution of Furze Platt Senior School's Year 11 students was held on Wednesday, June 21.


#### SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT FUND
