AN EVENING WITH AN IMMIGRANT

On Tuesday 21st November, the English Literature A-level students went to see An Evening with an Immigrant at Norden Farm to broaden our knowledge of the experience of immigration as part of out A-level literature course.

The evening was a very emotional insight into the life of Inua Ellams (poet, playwright, graphic artist and designer) who experienced huge upheaval when he moved to London in 1996, aged 12, to escape what is considered by many to be the Boko Haram territory. A loss of identification papers forced Inua and his family to 'uproot' the family again and move to Dublin while awaiting their immigration staus. Shortly after he was beginning to feel as though he was fitting into the Irish culture and lifestyle, another upheaval occurred and he had to move back to London with his family



due to having received threatening messages.

Despite not having a place to call home and through the trauma that he has experienced, Inua has triumphed through his career and performed shows at the National theatre and has met the Queen for his contribution to literature.

Inua told his story through a range of vivid and captivating poems, anecdotes and stories. With sincerity and techniques from oral traditions he guided the audience into understanding the reality of what he has had to endure.

Inua explained how not feeling as though he had a country or home to belong to made him believe that home is a journey with people, rather than a destination and described himself as a global citizen. He spoke of official statistics showing the positive contribution made by those who settle in our country. Inua certainly felt that the Human Rights Charter was essential for protecting those who have to flee



from their homes under duress. He highlighted the important work of Liberty in helping people in real need.

Initially, I viewed this as an academic A level literature trip; his performance has allowed me to question what identity and belonging truly represent, what immigrants must face outside the light of the media and whether there is anything that we as individuals can do to help. Overall, the evening was a very important and inspiring journey for myself, the students and the teachers who were privileged to attend such a poignant performance.

Wednesday 6th December 2017

There are a few places available on the Sixth Form Psychology trip to the Museum of National History, University of Oxford. This trip is primarily aimed at Psychology and Biology students but all Year 12 and 13 students are welcome to attend.

During the visit students will learn about the anatomy of the brain and will explore the methods of neuroimaging and neuroscience, in particular MRI and fMIR. We also hope that this visit will inspire them to consider continuing their education at university level.

The Museum has arranged for four university professors to deliver their lectures and for supportive staff to accompany us during the visit. There is no formal charge, however, a donation of £5 is suggested and will be collected by Miss Paradowska on the day – all money will be passed on to Museum officers. Students are also expected to cover the cost of the return train ticket to Oxford (approx. £20). We anticipate leaving on the 8.03am train and we shall be back in Maidenhead between 4.30pm and 6pm depending on train services available on return.
