


Ellis Ovens (Year 8), Henley - Fantastic feedback following the Open Evening regarding his conduct and behaviour during the tours.




Tendo Nyerenyere (Year 12), Marlow - Won second place in the 'Sculpture' category in the Windsor Festival Schools' Programme 2017.

PSYCHOLOGY TRIP TO ROYAL HOLLOWAY (UNIVERSITY OF LONDON)



Students studying Psychology visited Royal Holloway College (University of London) for a Psychology event on Tuesday. Twelve students from Year 12 looked at an exhibition of research studies which had been carried out by the RHC Psychology department, with the researchers on hand to explain their work. Afterwards followed three mini-lectures on the topics of: values and their frequencies; sleep, dreaming & effects on memory; and misconceptions concerning empathy and autism. complete a piece of coursework.



The Duke of Edinburgh Award (D of E) is the world's leading youth achievement award. It is a non-competitive programme of activities for anyone aged 14-24.

Participation in the D of E gives young people the opportunity to experience new activities or develop existing skills.

There are three progressive levels which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold award. The award is completed by choosing volunteering, physical and skills activities, going on an expedition, and for Gold only, taking part in a residential activity.

Volunteering - undertaking service to individuals or the community

Physical - improving an area of sport, dance or fitness activities

Skills - developing practical and social skills and personal interests

Expedition - planning, training for, and completion of, an adventurous journey in the UK or abroad

Residential - staying and working away from home during a shared activity

We are delighted to inform you that we will be delivering the Bronze Award to students in Years 9 & 10, and the Silver Award to those in Year 12.


