#### **FAQs**

I have lost my password – what do I do?

Go to the Go 4 Schools website, click the 'Parents' icon and follow the 'Forgotten your password' instructions.

My email address is not recognised / I have changed my email address?

Only email addresses registered with the school are recognised by Go 4 Schools. If your email address is not recognised it means that we do not hold your email address on our system. In order to update your information please contact us via email at <a href="mailto:reports@furzeplatt.net">reports@furzeplatt.net</a>. If you have changed your email address, when you next log in to Go 4 Schools you will need to go through the first time user process again as outlined at the start of these guidance notes.

Who can access my child's data on Go 4 Schools?

You, as the registered parent/carer, and school staff are the only people who can access your child's progress data.

When and how often should I access Go 4 Schools?

Student information is available constantly so that you can access it when you wish. Student progress data is updated on a half termly basis, so as the school year progresses more academic information will become available. We will notify you as and when new reports are published.

#### **SCHOOL NEWS**

#### **VISIT TO NETTLECOMBE**

On October 8<sup>th</sup> our two classes of A - level Biology students, accompanied by Mr A Molin and Dr M Scott, travelled to Nettlecombe Court Field Centre. Our four day trip was based around carrying out our assessed required practical work along with a number of other field studies.

On the evening of our arrival we met Anelma our teacher for the next four days, and set up humane mammal traps to place in the fields surrounding Nettlecombe. The purpose of this was to hopefully find a variation of small mammals e.g. mice to identify the next morning, and therefore see the distribution of small mammals in that area.

On the next day, we travelled back out into the fields to see whether we had successfully trapped any small mammals



overnight. We found that 3 out of the 12 traps we had placed in pairs, had successfully trapped small mammals, however all of them were of the same species: woodmice. This was a good introductory activity in being able to investigate the types of small mammal species that were in the fields next to where we were staying, and interesting to see them up close in an ethical manner.



Following the morning activity we travelled to Porlock Weir where we carried out experiments to see the variation of rock and water snail species along the coastline. Although this was not a required practical it helped in providing supplementary knowledge for our 'choice chambers' practical later on. Carrying out these experiments while being on the beach was a really nice way to learn and enjoy the views. Finally, in the evening we carried out a practical exercise, in which we used chromatography to separate the colours of leaves from dark and light areas to identify the different pigments within them.



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On Tuesday we travelled down to Embercombe in Exmoor after a brief introduction to the day's activities, to sample the abundance of invertebrates along different points of the river and compare quantities. During this we did our required practical 10 'choice chambers' with the mayfly larvae we acquired. By doing this in a field, we were able to experience assessed experiments outside the lab and obtain results that were a more accurate representation of real life biological investigations.



On the Wednesday morning we carried out our final required practical 12, in which we investigated the effect of steepness of a hill on the distribution of plant species on it. This final activity was a great way of putting our learning of different sampling techniques i.e. systematic sampling, into practice and carrying out statistical analyses of our results.

Travelling to Nettlecombe was a really nice contrast from carrying out experiments normally in a lab. But also, it was a great way of learning how ecology can be applied to real-life jobs. Overall it was a very positive trip which allowed every member of the group to learn and develop skills together, including those that apply to real life and not just school and studying.

#### **BOX HILL**

Year 11 Geographers visited Box Hill, situated in the North Downs, Surrey on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> October.

Part of the new curriculum requirement include practising fieldwork techniques, as well as measuring the human influence on the local ecosystems. Box Hill is unique in its calcareous grassland ecosystems and therefore a very interesting place to visit. Luckily the weather stayed dry throughout which meant visibility was good.

At the end of the day, students raced down to the bottom of Box Hill and then back up again which was exhausting!


