

#### YEAR 9 STEM VISIT TO GSK, MAIDENHEAD



A team of six Year 9 girls visited GSK in Maidenhead on Monday for the launch of a 10 week environmentallythemed STEM project called Go4Set.



This is run by the EDT charity with the aim of inspiring students towards STEM-based careers by linking education and industry in real life situations using hands on learning and skills development. In order to achieve this, the team has been assigned a mentor who is an automation engineer with GSK and who will advise on the project through regular meetings with the team.





The project will culminate in a presentation and awards day at GSK's headquarters in London when all 13 teams competing will be judged on their project, which will either be entitled "Energy and your school" or "The Eco Classroom". The girls have to produce a model, a written report of up to 50 pages, a visual display and a five minute presentation to be judged by a panel of experts. The day involved explaining how the project should run, the importance of good project management and of assigning different roles to different team members based on their skills set. In addition, we had a tour of the GSK factory which produces oral hygiene products for distribution all over the world. Watch this space for further updates as the project proceeds...

## FURZE PLATT STUDENTS WIN ROWING GOLD



The Oarsport Junior Sculling Head is a National competition and takes place every year at Dorney Lake. It's organised by the Scullery, an independent organisation dedicated to the support and development of Junior rowers at all levels across the UK. Maidenhead Rowing Club were represented by a number of FPSS students with Abby Jones and Ellen Gomersall (Year 9) winning Gold medals in their quad in a field of 44 crews.



Last Monday Victor Kleshnev, (Year 13) – as part of Maidenhead Rowing Club Juniors Quad - won the largest Head race for juniors in the country. He and his squad won the Schools' Head of the River at Tideway with a

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record breaking time of 26.5s faster than the previous record, set in 2012. On Tuesday Victor with the same crew won another National event at Dorney Lake, the Oarsport Junior Sculling Head.

Victor has been training using the equipment in the new school Gym, which has enabled him and his team mates to improve their fitness in peak areas.

#### NEW TEACHING BLOCK AND NEW HALL: FREE EVENT - INVITATION TO PARENTS' INFORMATION EVENING

We are delighted to confirm that construction of our new teaching block will commence during the Easter holidays. This is the first of two phases of site improvement and expansion:

#### Phase 1: April 2018-February 2019

Construction of new teaching block, with 4 new Science classrooms and 12 teaching rooms. This is being built towards the rear of the school, on the site currently occupied by one Science laboratory and two Philosophy and Religion classrooms.



#### Phase 2: February 2019-November 2019

Construction of second, additional hall. This will replace the current (old) gym and will also result in the demolition of four classrooms.

These are very exciting developments that will considerably enhance students' experience in and out of lessons. Great care and attention has been taken to minimise the impact on students and staff during the construction process. Four classrooms will be re-roomed, and new timetables will be issued to all students after Easter. We are working very closely with the contractors to ensure that any noise is kept to an absolute minimum, and that both lessons and, of course, examinations, are unaffected. New routes around school have already been devised, and will be shared with students after Easter.

This information evening is for anyone who is considering training to teach, including current teaching assistants, career changers, teachers trained overseas, and those graduating in summer 2018.


