IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER REGARDING JULY END OF TERM CHANGE OF DATE

Dear Parents and Carers

As you are probably aware, Furze Platt Senior School is part of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead's secondary school expansion strategy. This is a very exciting opportunity. The local authority is investing over £7 million in expanding and improving our facilities.

However, it is now clear that in order to ensure safety and minimise disruption to teaching over the next 18 months, we will need to close the school one week early in the Summer Term. Therefore, the last day that students will be required to attend school will be Friday 13th July 2018. This decision has not been taken lightly and we apologise for any inconvenience.

Representing Furze Platt in the RBWM Hockey League this week were our Years 7 and 8 Girls' Hockey team.




Despite the perishing cold, the girls played with determination and vigour throug

BISHAM STUDENT SURVEY



Students in Bisham House will be participating in a survey run by a researcher from the

Department of Psychology at Royal Holloway, University of London. The project involves investigating 13-18 year old's use of social networking sites (SNS) and the impacts of this use upon their social and emotional wellbeing. This research aims to explore access to SNS as well as perception of the risks and benefits of using SNS. Bisham pupils will be provided with the opportunity to discuss any further ideas that they have about SNS use via an anonymous platform.

We will be provided with a summary of the findings at the end of the study.


