We hope your son / daughter enjoyed their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award practice expedition recently.

Please note that all assessor's reports are now due, and the deadline to complete the Bronze Award is Friday 25th May.

Further to feedback from students, staff and expedition leaders, please see below for important information from BXM Expeditions relating to the assessment expedition on the 12th & 13th May.



- To make it less chaotic when dropping your child off, we have decided to stagger the start times. Please bear this in mind if you are lift sharing and ensure if lifts are shared they are with the correct groups as groups will be starting and finishing at different places.
- Groups 1- 6 from Group A, and Groups 12- 17 from Group B should arrive at their start point for 9.30am.
- Groups 7- 11 from Group A, and Groups 18- 22 from Group B should arrive at their start point for 10am.
- Parents must wait for students to be signed in by the Instructor before making their way home. Once students have signed in please depart promptly to allow students to get walking as quickly as possible and free up space in the car parks.
- Students must not use their phones during the assessment. Students are only permitted to use their phones for emergency use only and for taking photos if it is part of their aim. Any student caught using their phone for anything other than this could contribute to the whole group being deferred.



- Students are expected to demonstrate excellent behaviour and treat staff from BXM with respect at all times.
- Please encourage your child to pack their own rucksack for the assessment (tips on how to do this can be found online using the link below) and plan their own meals.

REGENERATION TALK FOR YEAR 12 GEOGRAPHY STUDENTS

On Monday 23rd April, Year 12 A-level Geography students were pleased to hear Zoe Mulholland (Development Manager) and Richard Broom (Landscape Architect) present a regeneration talk following the Maidenhead Regeneration Exhibition that students attended in January.

As part of the A-Level Geography specification, which covers the regeneration topic, students were able to ask questions and gain an indepth understanding of the planning and players involved in the regeneration process that is scheduled to take place over the next 3 years. Students were asked to reflect on the numerous aspects to consider in the planning process which include the Planning Statement, Economic Commercial Market Report, Archaeological Assessment, Heritage, Flood Risk Assessment, Biodiversity Assessment, Retail Impact Assessment amongst several others. This highlighted the significance of evaluating a place's economic, social and environmental characteristics in order to measure its need for regeneration and to tailor the proposals according to these factors.

Countryside is RBWM's Development Partner and has been recruited to oversee the regeneration of four main sites. The first project is to commence at York Road with the initiative

of creating new public spaces, activity in outer areas of the centre, improving access to York Stream, connecting pedestrian environments and designing an improved setting to the existing civic buildings. Zoe also introduced the idea of sustainable development and the necessity of respecting natural and historic environments whilst creating high quality design features. Richard talked about the creation of a new cultural quarter which will embrace open, green spaces as an alternative to the residential sector and the use of public art to contribute to the re-imaging of the town centre. The edges of the plaza will have a range of restaurants to attract further retail and commercial businesses and therefore visitors.

Being able to hear Zoe and Richard's contribution to our town's future regeneration enabled students to think about the ways of measuring the success of these projects. Zoe outlined that success is primarily connected to increasing the value of property and profitability, whereas Richard described his view of success being able to eventually see the engagement of people in the animated atmosphere and architecture drawn from his initial designs. He also acknowledged the range of scales for regenerating an area from a town strategy to sculptures or seating.

The discussion allowed us to apply our knowledge of geography to the wider context of Maidenhead town centre and both Zoe and Richard said that they would be able to provide work experience opportunities for any students considering these career paths. Overall, the session was very informative and we all appreciated their time. We look forward to the implementation of these proposals and the future success of Maidenhead's regeneration.

GO 4 SCHOOLS - PASSWORD CHANGE UPDATE

Go 4 Schools have been enhancing the compliance of their system in light of the tightening of the Data Protection Regulations (also known as the General Data Protection Regulations or GDPR) due for implementation on 25 May 2018.

As a result of this, all passwords in Go 4 Schools will be set to expire after a period of 6 months. The company have also introduced a tougher security policy to strengthen passwords.

Password security policy: We are applying a new password strength policy across the system, meaning that all new passwords must meet new criteria (8 or more characters, plus a mixture of uppercase, lowercase, numbers and non-alphanumeric characters).

If you have forgotten your password there is now a time limited 'password reset' link.

New password / password reset mechanism:


the mechanism by which a user gets an initial password (or a new password) has been changed to send a time-limited 'password reset' link to their email address (rather than send a new password directly).

These changes will affect students and parents.
