

We have a number of important dates and events coming up after half term for Year 12 students, so please be aware of the following information:

Pre Public Exams (PPEs):

- **Monday 18th & Tuesday 19th June - Year 12 Art & Photography PPEs:** Students to attend school at normal time. The exam duration is 5 hours with 2 breaks, and students will finish school as normal at 3.15pm.
- **Monday 25th – Thursday 28th June- Year 12 PPE period:** During these 4 days, students will be on full exam/study leave and will not be expected to attend any school sessions (tutor time, assemblies, tutorials etc.) and will only be expected to attend their exams. All students must wear clothing that meets with the Sixth Form's dress code whilst at school during this week. All students have an individual timetable issued to them outlining the times of their

exams. Please note that the morning exams are due to start at 8.45am and students should arrive at 8.30am to be ready to start at 8.45am. Afternoon exams will start at 12.30pm and students should arrive at 12.15pm to be ready to start at 12.30pm.

- **Friday 29th June - Year 12 Careers Day:** The day will consist of a variety of seminars and workshops that will assist students with planning for and developing skills for their future careers. Further details and information to follow shortly. All students must arrive at school promptly at 8.40am.

Work Experience Week:

- **Monday 9th to Friday 13th July - Year 12 Work Experience week:** All students need to secure their work experience placement, complete and hand in their work experience forms as soon as possible or by the deadline of Friday 25th May.

YEAR 13 STUDY LEAVE

As Year 13 students enter their final exams at Furze Platt Senior School please be aware of the following arrangements for your information. Year 13 students will be on full study leave from Monday 4th June, however please note that they are more than welcome to attend any of their usual timetabled lessons from this date. All subject teachers will be running revision sessions at these times, even though it is not compulsory to attend. Students attending these revision sessions must continue to adhere to the Sixth Form dress code. The revision lessons will cease once the final exam has been sat for that subject. We hope that the vast majority of students will take up this opportunity. We wish every Year 13 student well for their exams.



