Exam Results

All these individual success stories added up to the second best results in Furze Platt's history. However, within the results were some new records: for example, students gained more A-A* grades at A Level than ever before. Similarly, the number of students passing GCSE maths and English was a best ever result.

UPDATE ON NEW CANTEEN AND DINING FACILITIES



This week, students will have noticed considerable changes in our canteen and dining facilities, a result of significant building work that took place over the summer holidays. We now have two serveries - an upper servery focusing on hot meals, and a lower servery which will serve cold food. There is now far more space for students to eat inside, sitting at tables, and students are able to eat their hot food from plates with metal cutlery. Having heard feedback from students last year, we have also focused on the quality of food. We have employed a new head chef / kitchen manager - Debbie Horsfall - and students are already saying they are enjoying the food more. There has been a lovely atmosphere in the canteen and the hall, with more staff and students eating together. Ms Horsfall has produced a 3-week menu showing the hot food that will be available, in addition to the cold food that is served on a daily basis.

The new facilities are, however, a work in progress. We are awaiting a delivery of new kitchen equipment, which will further improve the quality and range of hot food that we can offer. We have not yet opened the lower (cold) servery, and hope to open it in the coming days. We are awaiting further deliveries of trays, crockery and cutlery, to ensure that all hot food can be eaten from plates. Further down the line we will be ordering more chairs and tables, to enable even more students to eat in a leisurely and relaxed fashion. Some of these changes will happen in the coming weeks; others will take place in the longer term.

Students should pay for food using the money in their Wisepay account. Parents can top this up online (there is a link on the home page of our website), or can bring cash into the school reception which will then be uploaded to Wisepay. Students may, of course, bring packed lunches in.


