

MESSAGE FROM RBWM - PUBLIC CONSULTATION



DEADLINE SUNDAY 3RD OCTOBER

URGENT - Help your child travel to school more safely!

Does your child walk or cycle to school, or you would like them to, but you are worried about the traffic on their journey? Are you concerned about traffic outside the school? Here is your chance to make your child's journey to school safer and more enjoyable.

The RBWM is carrying out an important consultation on active transport in the borough. It needs feedback and ideas from as many FPSS students, parents and staff as possible, so it can target improvements to pavements, cycle lanes and roads in the places our children need them the most.

The public consultation will close very soon on **Sunday**, **October 3rd**, so it's important you add your child's and your own ideas for improvements for their school journey to the consultation **NOW**.

Example improvements for school journeys might be traffic calming measures for the busy road outside FPSS main entrance; improving the safety of pavements and junctions on routes into school; upgrading and extending the cycle path from Cookham to Maidenhead or making new cycle lanes where needed. You can add ideas for improvements to other journeys you make too.

TRAVEL FORWARDS TOGETHER IN RBWM

Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the 'View info and ideas' button for one or more of the themes: walking; cycling; school friendly streets and people friendly streets. This will take you to a page with more information, a survey and interactive map for the theme(s) you are interested in.

Please make sure you add more pins to the interactive map for your theme(s). Even if your child's or your own idea for an improvement already has a pin, or you read and agree with a different idea someone else has suggested, it's important you add another pin to the map to support it. The more pins an idea has, the more chance the RBWM will make it happen. If you find the interactive map a bit fiddly then please ask your child to help you with it, as they will probably find using it much easier!

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WEAR SOMETHING GREEN / NON-UNIFORM DAY

FRIDAY 15TH OCTOBER

Our school will be taking part in JUST ONE Tree Day on Friday 15th October. Each student is being encouraged to wear their own clothes / something green and bring in £1 to fund the planting of their tree.

SCHOOL TOURS INFORMATION



LAC (LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN) AND PLAC (PREVIOUSLY LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN)

Schools in England can receive £2,345 p.a. for each Previously Looked After Child (PLAC), but only if their eligibility is declared on the October school census.

The Department of Education defines Previously Looked-After Children (PLAC) as: Children who are no longer looked after by the local authority in England and Wales because they are the subject of an Adoption, Special Guardianship or Child Arrangement Order. (This currently does not include children who have been returned home to parents after being in care by the Local authority.) The child/young person must have been in care in England and Wales to qualify for Pupil Premium Plus (PP+) funding. Any child attending school from the start of reception to the end of Year 11 (summer term) is eligible to receive PP+. Children who are electively home educated or are post-16 students are currently not eligible for post-Looked After Child (LAC) PP+. The Pupil Premium grant per PLAC Pupil for 2021-2022 is £2345.

'SHOW RACISM THE RED CARD'

HOW IT ALL STARTED

'Show Racism the Red Card (SRtRC) is the UK's largest anti -racism educational charity. It was established in January 1996, thanks in part to a donation by then Newcastle United goalkeeper Shaka Hislop (pictured).

In 1990s Newcastle, Shaka was at a petrol station near St James Park when he was confronted with a group of young people shouting racist abuse at him. After one of the group realised that they had been shouting at Shaka Hislop, the



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Newcastle United football player, they came over to ask for an autograph.

It was from this experience that Shaka realised he could harness his status as a professional player to make a difference. Coupled with the power of football and his status as a role model, Shaka thought education could be an effective strategy in challenging racism in society.

At the charity's first ever event, Shaka and fellow teammate John Beresford visited Gosforth High School in the North East to speak to pupils about his experiences in football and society and the rest is history!'
