YEAR 11 SCIENCE PRE PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS



On Monday, Year 11 students will be sitting their Science Paper 2 PPE for Biology.

Monday 25th March – Biology

- Topics B10-16 Separate science, B10-15 Combined science.
- Practicals: Response time, Sampling, effect of light & gravity on seedlings (Separate science only)
- Practicals: Hooke's Law, Force & extension, Infrared radiation, Waves (ripple tank & string), Reflection & refraction* (Separate Science only)
- Remember, you do NOT need to memorize the equations!

- **Recap the topics** using Youtube ("Free science lessons") or GCSE Pod activities that are set for you

YEAR 8 – LANGUAGES OPTIONS CHOICES



At Furze Platt students choose their GCSE options in Year 9 and will continue to study a broad curriculum, ensuring students are well prepared for their GCSEs which start in Year 10. Students will choose their GCSE options during Term 3 in 2024. However, to prepare students for the demands of GCSEs some subjects in Year 9 will be given slightly more lesson time than in Years 7 and 8.

This week all Year 8 students had a tutor presentation that explained that students will choose to focus on just one language in Year 9 from September 2024.

You can also indicate if your child wishes to continue studying two languages. Further information about how lessons for a second language will be structured will be sent once students have made their choices.

The language the student chooses to continue studying in Year 9 will be the language taken to GCSE level, if they continue with languages. This is therefore an important decision to make. To help students with their decision, languages teachers will discuss language options during



Please take care to only select the revision classes that your child will definitely be attending. RA (Raising Achievement) revision workshops are by invitation only and students attending these sessions will be invited separately by Mrs Feather.

w/c 22.4.24: Exam Timetables

Personalised exam timetables have been given out. It is important that students check these thoroughly so they know when their exams are. Making a copy of this timetable is often a good idea. Students will also receive the official JCQ exam regulations information with their timetables. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

9.5.24 - 22.5.23: Exam Phase 1

The main body of exams starts in full on Thursday 9th May. During Exam Phase 1, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until

8.45am if they have a 9.00am exam or 9.10am if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

23.5.24 - 19.6.24: Exam Phase 2

From Thursday 23rd May Exam Phase 2 starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.

Details of the revision programme that will run during Exam Phases 1 & 2 will be published shortly after the exam boards confirm the final exam timetable.


