YEAR 11 EXAM REVISION

Revision Packs

Revision resources for each subject are on FP-Cloud under Raising Achievement and Year 11. Within this site there are links to subject-specific revision websites, revision guides, how to revise tutorials, and past papers with their associated mark schemes, examiners' reports etc.

w/c 22.4.24: Exam Timetables

Personalised exam timetables have been given out. It is important that students check these thoroughly so they know when their exams are. Making a copy of this timetable is often a good idea. Students will also receive the official JCQ exam regulations information with their timetables. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

9.5.24 - 22.5.23: Exam Phase 1

The main body of exams starts in full on Thursday 9th May. During Exam Phase 1, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until 8.45am if they

have a 9.00am exam or 9.10am if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

23.5.24 - 19.6.24: Exam Phase 2

From Thursday 23rd May Exam Phase 2 starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.

YEAR 11 EXAM TIMETABLE ACCESS





YEAR 10 PSHE



Dear Parent/Carer,

As part of your child's education at Furze Platt Senior School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health, Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy and productive lives.

I am writing to let you know that starting from Monday 13th May, your child's class will be taking part in three trial lessons which will focus on sexual consent and the law in collaboration with the College of Policing. By doing so this brings a wealth of expertise in areas like crime prevention and conflict resolution which are valuable topics for students to learn about. It helps in delivering more informed and effective education on important societal issues, promoting safer communities and responsible citizenship.

This then leads the relationships and sex education (RSE) areas of the PSHE programme which will formally commence at the beginning of June. RSE at Furze Platt will follow the Department for Education's statutory guidance that came into effect September 2020. RSE lessons in Year 10 will include teaching about: healthy and unhealthy relationships, including friendships and intimate relationships; keeping safe and consent; contraception options; pregnancy choices; and STIs. Students will have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern

world.

The purpose of inclusive RSE at FPSS is to provide knowledge and understanding of safe and healthy relationships based on love and respect. This is to encourage the development of safe and healthy relationships in later life. The unit will equip students with the knowledge and skills to make informed and healthy choices; to build their confidence and skills to deal with situations they may encounter; to help them to stay safe and know where and how to ask for help if needed.

We hope that students will have the opportunity to have a session run by the youth team from DASH (Domestic Abuse Stops Here), who support families in Berkshire and Buckinghamshire. The team will explore what makes healthy relationships, informed consent and where to receive support should it be required.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by staff and governors at Furze Platt Senior School. Please visit the school's website:

PARENT INFORMATION LETTER







Arrangements for the FPSS 2025 Ski Trip are now confirmed!

We will depart on Saturday 5th April and return on Saturday 12th April. After the success of previous year's trips we will again be travelling with Interski. For 2025 we are visiting La Thuile, Aosta Valley, Italy. Full of 33 blue runs, 32 red runs and 15 black runs.

Students will receive ski/snowboarding tuition for 5 days, with a teacher supervised lunch hour. Instruction will be provided by the Interski BASI (British Association of Ski Instructors) qualified instructors.



We recognise that skiing and snowboarding is an expensive pastime, and sadly costs have risen significantly. The destination is a high altitude resort due to the time of year which also impacts the price but helps to create the best possible conditions for snow sports.

The cost of the 2025 holiday is £1495 for both Skiers and Snowboarders, and includes:

- Travel to and from the resort on a luxury coach
- An extensive 5 day lift pass that covers the full La Thuile resort
- Five nights' accommodation at Hotel Residence Planibel, only a short walk from the ski lift system
- Full board accommodation (half board in the hotel/hot lunch provided on the mountain)
- Five hours of instruction per day with plus a teacher

- supervised lunch hour
- An exciting après ski programme each evening outside of the hotel in the wider resort
- A fully comprehensive winter sports insurance package
- A full week's ski equipment hires (including skis and ski poles or snowboard, boots, and helmet). (Please note not included is the hire or purchase of any ski clothing.)



The trip is open to all current Year 7-12 students who will still be at the school in April 2025. All who wish to come on the trip should pay a deposit of £150 (for skiers and snowboarders). Please could all deposits be paid by 12 noon on Friday 10th May.

Please note that if the trip is over-subscribed names will be drawn from a hat.

Please pay your deposit via your ParentMail account (Ski Trip 2025 deposit will be found in the Shop in the payments tab). This deposit is non-refundable if your child secures a place on the trip.

If the trip is over-subscribed, unsuccessful applicants will have the choice of remaining on a waiting list or having their deposit refunded. (All deposits for anyone who does not secure a place on the trip will ultimately be refunded).

Should a student wish to withdraw from the trip after having secured a place, a refund of the deposit (subject to an admin fee) may only be available in the event of a replacement being found. Current Year 11 students who plan to stay at FPSS for 6th Form will not be required to pay any further instalments (beyond the deposit) until their place in Year 12 is confirmed.

You will be contacted week commencing 20th confirming whether or not your child has a place on the trip, and when the remaining payment instalments will be due. Final payment will be due in December 2024.

Please note that, due to decreasing uptake, Interski has warned us that snowboarding groups may not run with students being asked to switch to skiing if numbers are not high enough. This is not specific to Furze Platt and Interski has always merged snowboard groups with other schools in the resort wherever possible. There are simply, increasingly few student opting to snowboard across all school groups.

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Your child must have their own passport. Under current rules, any non-EU citizens must have at least 3 months to run from the date of our expected return (expiry date of at least 12th July 2025), while EU citizens merely need to be valid until the date of return (Saturday 12th April 2025). If your child requires a new passport, please allow plenty of time for their application to be processed and notify us well in advance of our date of departure. Please be aware that no refunds can be made if your child is unable to travel due to an irregularity with their passport.

If your child holds a non-EU passport, they may also require a visa:

Your son/daughter will also require a Global/European Health Insurance Card (GHIC or EHIC). This can be obtained by calling 0300 330 1350 or via the website below.

UK GHIC OR UK EHIC APPLICATION

Please Note - The school reserves the right to remove a pupil from the trip at any point for unacceptable behaviour or with suitable reasoning up to the trip departing. In this case it may not be possible to refund all of the money that has been paid.


