Team Indonesia

Hello, my name is Adam Somerville and I am taking part in the Operation Wallacea Expedition to Indonesia in 2018. I am in Year 12, studying Chemistry, Biology and Psychology, and after Sixth Form I am hoping to do a Pharmacy degree at university.

I heard about the Mexico Expedition (which took place last year) and was fascinated by the work that Operation Wallacea do and by the opportunity an expedition like this presents. Therefore, when I heard about the Indonesia trip I knew it was something that I would love to do.

The trip consists of one week in the Forest, where we will be trained to carry out a range of surveys, including monitoring Bat communities, Bird surveys, and distribution of the forest canopy.

In the second week, we will be diving in the coral reefs surrounding Indonesia and learning survey techniques used to monitor the ecosystem. Throughout this time, we will be having lectures, allowing us to develop our knowledge about the conservation work.

I am very keen on learning new skills and hope to broaden my understanding of the cultures and environmental differences between Indonesia and Britain.

However, we shall have to organise and carry out fundraising events in order to get there. We have recently been selling raffle tickets at parents evening and have raised about £300 so far.

In the future, we are planning to sell coffees and refreshments at the PTFA Table Top sales, which are held in the hall. The next sale is on Sunday 12th March.

We have recently had a fundraising advice meeting by Operation Wallacea and we are now putting together ideas for larger events we can hold, such as car washes and a quiz night. We will be sure to let you know about these in advance!
