NEW TEACHING BLOCK AND NEW HALL: FREE EVENT - INVITATION TO PARENTS' INFORMATION EVENING



We are delighted to confirm that construction of our new teaching block will commence during the Easter holidays. This is the first of two phases of site improvement and expansion:



Phase 1: April 2018-February 2019

Construction of new teaching block, with 4 new Science classrooms and 12 teaching rooms. This is being built towards the rear of the school, on the site currently occupied by one Science laboratory and two Philosophy and Religion classrooms.

Phase 2: February 2019-November 2019

Construction of second, additional hall. This will replace the current (old) gym and will also result in the demolition of four classrooms.

BTEC BUSINESS EXAMINATION PART A AND PART B - DATES

Part A - from Monday 16th April (in class)

Part B - 3 hour exam Monday 30th April

I am writing to inform you of the dates of the forthcoming BTEC Business exam your child will be sitting next month.

Unit 2 – Developing a Marketing Campaign is split into two parts:

Part A – This consists of six hours preparation period where the students will gather data based on a set scenario that they will be given at the beginning of session 1. This will take place in Business lessons from Monday 16th April. This is classed as having low level control which means it will be completed in lessons and with access to the internet. Students will be required to complete six sides of A4 paper which they will be allowed to take into the controlled exam (Part B).

Please note: an external exam register is still taken and any absence must be certified by yourself or a doctor for the student.

Part B – The exam is set during a three hour period which is taken by all BTEC Business students at the same time and takes place in one session. This has a high level of control which means it will be completed without the internet, with an invigilator and the work will be sent away to be externally assessed. This session will take place on MONDAY 30th APRIL from 9am. Again an external examination register is taken so any absence must be certified by yourself or a doctor.
