If you think your child may be entitled to Free School Meals (which comes with additional financial benefits) please fill in the application form:

FREE SCHOOL MEALS APPLICATION

All applications are treated in the strictest confidence. Your eligibility status will appear on screen within minutes, but can take up to 48 hours to validate, and the school is also notified of the outcome. There is no need to bring any documentation into school. The current daily allowance for free school meals is £2.50.

Please note: The school also receives additional funding if your child is eligible for Free School Meals, so we strongly encourage you to take up this entitlement.

BVL is a social mobility charity which aims to gets students from non-fee paying schools to explore the legal system as a potential career path.

There are 5 projects that Year 12 students could apply for (please click on the name of each one for more details):

The Blair Partnership & Pottermore Publishing.

This will be an insight evening on Zoom from 5-7pm on 11th July 2023 and **the deadline to apply is Tuesday 20th June 7pm.**

This is to learn more about a career as an in house lawyer, for example for a literary and entertainment agency.

The London Media Law Insight Programme with 5 hybrid sessions in July and August, some over Teams and some in person in London (travel expenses will be paid) and the deadline to apply is Tuesday 20th June at 7pm.

This is to learn more about a career as a lawyer specialising in privacy, reputation management and data protection. You will participate in interactive workshops on the work of a lawyer working in media law.

The Model Law Commission from September 2023 to January 2024. This will be hybrid with some sessions over Zoom and some face to face in London. Travel expenses will be paid. Deadline to apply is Friday 8th September.

On this 3 month project, students will simulate the work of the Law Commission to reform laws

The Mooting Competition from February to April 2024, which will be 11 sessions over Zoom from 6-8pm. You need to apply by Thursday 4th January 2024.

Students will have the opportunity to compete in our Mooting Competition in association with the Supreme Court. A 'moot' simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal), in which participants analyse a fictional case, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions and then present an oral argument.

Introduction to Legal System from May to July 2024 – mostly held over Zoom but one day in London (travel expenses will be paid). The deadline to apply is Thursday 28th March 2024.

This gives students a chance to look at a case which was recently heard in the Supreme Court. Participants will review the decision made by the court, before coming to their own conclusions and writing a report outlining their thoughts and giving their own judgments.
