On Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2024 there will be an opportunity for the parents/carers of students in Year 8 to meet their subject teachers. Face to face appointments are available between 3.45-7.45pm in the Theatre and Main Hall.

The appointments are available to book now and close on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March at 2pm.

Parents' Evenings are very important events that allow you to gain helpful insights into your child's progress, discuss upcoming assessments and find out how families can support students with revision, therefore we would you request that you attend the appointments with your child.

School Cloud is a platform whereby you will have an opportunity to book your appointments with your child's subject teachers in advance. #### **PARENTS' EVENING BOOKINGS**

Appointments have been capped at seven appointments initially per child; this is to allow every parent access to speak to subject staff. Our primary goal is to ensure that every parent has fair and equal access to feedback from their child's subjects. With children studying more than 10 subjects, a completely unrestricted booking system could lead to a scenario where only a small percentage of parent's secure appointments, leaving many without the opportunity for valuable feedback. By implementing a limit, we aim to distribute these opportunities more evenly among parents. Closer to the evening we will release remaining appointments slots for parents to potentially access more subjects.

To maintain the efficiency and punctuality of the event, we have also enforced a five-minute travel time between appointments. This buffer helps ensure that each meeting runs smoothly and stays within the allotted time frame.

We look forward to seeing you on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March.



# Little literacy lessons for families

A research project for refugee families from Ukraine

#### Call for refugee families from Ukraine with primary-school-aged children.

The <u>Little Literacy Lessons for Families</u> research project is a training programme empowering families to lead their own reading and writing activities at home and support their children to develop their literacy skills.

#### Why take part?

- To learn more about how your child learns to read and write and feel more empowered to support them.
- To boost your child's motivation to read at home doing fun activities inspired by their interests.
- To connect with other families sharing similar interests, wanting to boost their children's literacy skills or their own confidence in supporting their children.

#### What will happen if I take part?

- One Saturday afternoon a month, from March to the end of May 2024, the families will meet with the
  project team in the Ukrainian Community Centre in Reading for group training sessions.
- The training will be delivered by expert educators from the University of Reading with long experience of teaching and researching reading and writing development with young multilingual learners.
- A member of the project team will **guide**, **advise** and **support** you to lead reading and writing activities with your child at home for the duration of the programme.
- We will ask your views and experience of family training at different times during the programme.

#### How do I take part?

- To take part, you must be a Ukrainian refugee family with a primary-school aged child moved to the UK
  in the last 2 years, and willing to learn more about how to support your child with reading and writing at
  home.
- You don't need any prior knowledge to join and live interpreting will be available for the duration of the programme. Childcare during the sessions would be available as well.

#### What families have said about the Little Literacy Lessons for Families programme

"It was great to have suggested activities as sometimes it is difficult to come up with engaging activities that have a clear goal to achieve."

"I liked: The range of activities, the fact that I could find different activities

that suit me and my child. Learning through play."

"It made me think that there are more activities to try out and to keep finding the ones they find interesting/engaging."

"Spending time with just me and my daughter and seeing her progress and enjoy herself."


