


STEM AMBASSADOR VISITS FURZE PLATT



This week the Science department welcomed Armelle Boisset, an electrical engineer and STEM ambassador, to give a talk about careers in Engineering.

Armelle has worked in the telecommunications industry for over 20 years, in both technical and management ranging roles from software coding and emergency support to mobile network rollout. Armelle talked about her early career (starting with an electrical engineering degree in Canada) and then went on to discuss the interests and benefit that a career in STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics) can bring, drawing on examples from her own career progression. She used a range of props – from old mobile phones, to smurfs to a tube of Pringles (which the students very much enjoyed devouring) to illustrate the maths behind hyperbolic parabolas. One of Armelle’s roles as a STEM ambassador is to encourage more girls to consider a career in engineering and it was good to see that they made up over 50% of our audience.

We hope our visitor will have inspired many of Furze Platt’s students to be the engineers of the future.

I am studying the standard compulsory subjects, like English, Maths and Science, as well as Geography, Resistant Materials and Child Development. I am very happy with the options that I chose and hope to succeed in my exams. In September when I join the Sixth Form at this school, I am hoping to study Geography, Product Design and Photography as A-Levels. Eventually I would like to study documentary photography at university.

I first found out about the trip the day before the initial meeting, and I am very glad I found out about it. I chose to go on the Indonesia trip to get the experience of learning how to fundraise with a team. I think going on this trip will be an amazing opportunity, as not many people will get the chance in their life to sleep in a rainforest. am very excited and it will be my first time going to that part of the world.

We have done many different fundraising activities such as car washing and selling raffle tickets at parents evening. I am also fundraising outside of school. I have been selling cakes at tea parties and doing odd jobs for family, friends and neighbours. As a group, we have raised a lot of money. Our first big payment was last week and we all had a reduction of amount of money we needed to pay, this was because of the amount of fundraising we had done. We are all motivated to do well in our fundraising.

In the first week, we will be living in cloud rainforests of Sulawesi. Here we will be collecting data about butterflies, bugs, bats, plants and frogs. We will also be climbing up into the canopies. I am looking forward to exploring the rainforest, as it will be an environment that I have not experienced before.

In the second week, we will be staying by the coast on white sand beaches. When we are there, we will be getting our scuba diving gear on and looking at the conservation of fish, we will also be checking for coral bleaching. During these two weeks, we will also have lectures and lessons to broaden our knowledge about Indonesia and the ecosystems they have.

Did you know Indonesia holds the largest plant in the world it is called rafflesia arnoldii. It can grow to be 3 feet across and weigh up to 15 pounds!
