APPRENTICESHIPS: AN ALTERNATIVE PATHWAY TO A CAREER IN SCIENCE





On Tuesday 17th January, the science department was visited by Oliver Sayers, an apprentice at GlaxoSmithKline in Maidenhead. Oliver's presentation delved into GSK and provided the cohort of upper school students and sixth-formers with information regarding GSK apprenticeships as an alternative pathway into scientific careers.

The prelude of the talk was an insight into the scale of GSK, as the world's 6th largest pharma corporation. GSK purveys 4 billion packs of medicine, 800 million vaccines and 18 billion other healthcare products on an annual basis. Glaxo's Maidenhead site is a corporate landmark, supplying Europe's demand for big brand oral healthcare products such as Sensodyne and Aquafresh. The Maidenhead site produces 400 million tubes of toothpaste a year, a startling 9 Olympic swimming pools worth of the product.

Oliver, went on to discuss the apprenticeship opportunities offered by Glaxo. Across a broad spectrum of subjects, not limited to supply and demand, microbiology and chemistry, the apprenticeship programs yields nationally recognised qualifications and guaranteed employment with the corporation. Ranging from 2-4 years in length, candidates fortify team-working and communication skills and are offered a competitive salary as a part of the 'earn whilst you learn' paradigm. He gave us an insight into his own career path, having decided that an apprenticeship was a better option for him post-18 than university was.

The 45-minute seminar was an insight into apprenticeships as a viable alternative to tertiary level education and their emergence as a means of procuring employment in the economically important science sector. Hi, I'm Daniel Harley and I am one of the students participating in the Indonesia expedition in 2018. I am currently in Year 12 studying Biology, Psychology and Business at A-level here at the school. When I first discovered about the expedition to Indonesia, I couldn't resist the chance to take part and expand my knowledge.

I was intrigued to take part simply because I have never taken part in anything like this within the UK, where I am familiar with the surroundings, let alone on the other side of the world. Therefore, I knew this was a great opportunity to learn more and explore different cultures, and for someone who gets bored of the same routine day to day, I would love to try something new. With Indonesia holding more than 700 languages within its borders, this shows the immense diversity it holds.

On the expedition, we will take part in a spectrum of activities. These include species conservation and analysis in the jungle and marine habitats. As Indonesia is currently the 3rd largest emitter of greenhouse gases in the world, it feels relevant to attempt to protect these species in the best way we can. Another activity we will carry out is scuba diving in the second week of the expedition; something I have always wanted to give a go from a young age. Indonesia would be the perfect place to do so, especially as scientists have previously measured a total of 1,233 marine species inhabiting the tropical waters of Indonesia. Therefore, it would be a rare experience to witness just a few of these.

I have always been someone who aspires to follow some form of career related to Biology, therefore I believe this expedition will be a fantastic insight into the future, as well as giving me some skills that could give me the boost I need.

In terms of fundraising, we are aiming to participate in activities in and out of the school term. This may include raffle sales; with permission from the school to sell tickets, generously provided by Operation Wallacea. These are planned to take place during parents and information evenings throughout the year. In addition to this, the team are also considering car washes and sponsored walk as a possible aid to help raise the funds we need.


