

## **FPSS TO HELP CONSERVATION IN INDONESIA**

Last year, a group of students from Furze Platt set off to Calakmul in the Mexican forest, to help collect data on the native flora and fauna. Their conservation work directly contributed to a presentation at the recent annual Selva Maya Conference. Not only did this directly influence the policies of Calakmul and the department of protected areas in other Mexican locations but it also attracted the attention of forest protection agencies in Guatemala and Belize.

Following on from this very successful school expedition, Furze Platt has now started preparing for its latest mission to help with world conservation. In July 2018, 15 budding "David Attenboroughs" will be embarking on a trip to the cloud forests of Sulawesi in Indonesia. Each student will be studying and collecting data that will be used to secure funding to help protect this unique bio-geographic region.

However, this will not only be a two-week trip designed to help protect the endemic species but also a test of each student's organisational and entrepreneurial skills, because each student must raise £2,800 to go on the expedition. So over the next eighteen months. "Team Indonesia" will be organising a number of fund raising events to help their cause.

Each week, you'll get to meet a different member of the team, who will tell you a little something about themselves, as well as keeping you updated on the latest fund raising progress.

# The Autism Group @ Home



New from Maidenhead based charity The Autism Group – a free visit at home service offering 1:1 support to parents and carers of individuals of any age with a diagnosis on the autism spectrum.

An initial phone consultation is followed by two visits from a qualified autism professional who is also a parent of someone on the spectrum. Each session of up to two hours is delivered in the carer's home:



To listen and respond to specific areas of difficulty by suggesting tried and tested strategies aimed at improving communication, behaviour and well-being for those on the spectrum and those caring for them.



A follow up visit a month later to provide an opportunity to discuss, reflect, assess the effectiveness of suggested approaches and signpost to other useful sources of support.
