# PRE-PUBLIC EXAMS - MARCH 2016



The Sixth Form Pre-Public Exams (PPEs) will take place from Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2016. All students will be examined in all of their subjects (with the exception of vocational courses).

Subject teachers will be informing students about which units will be examined in order to help them prepare. More details and a timetable can be found on by clicking <u>here</u>. Students will receive individual timetables which will have details of their seating and specific exam times, including any AS retakes.

Study Leave will be in operation during the PPE programme. There will be no Sixth Form lessons on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> March, therefore students will only be required to be in school for their exams. Students are expected to revise and prepare for their exams in the environment that suits them best, whether that is at home or coming in to school to use the study rooms. All our usual facilities will be open all week.

Please may I ask you to work with your son/daughter to ensure that they prepare appropriately for the PPEs. They should be following a revision timetable and working steadily and sustainably towards the exams. PPEs are essential preparation for the final AS / A2 examinations next summer.



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# TEAM MEXICO UPDATE:

In preparation for this July's expedition, during half-term we took 13 of our intrepid adventurers on a PADI scuba diving course run by Quest-Adventures (http://www.quest-adventures.co.uk/) who sent four instructors to spend the day with us. Beforehand, the students (and staff) had to study the theory of diving and provide evidence of having completed five knowledge review tests. It was a very long but fruitful day. We left school at 7am and initially spent 5 hours in the pool at Wycombe Abbey School (see below for photos). It was extremely hard work but we all passed the confined water practical tests. At lunchtime, we headed back to FPSS to review what we had learned and sit the theory tests. The pass mark was 75% and incredibly we all scored well over 80%. Our instructor Lee and the rest of his team were full of praise for the students: "myself and the rest of the crew really enjoyed our time with you all, we do love what we do but it's an extra pleasure when we get to teach a group as responsive and prepared as yours. They were a credit to the school." We now have to complete four open water dives in Mexico to get our full PADI Open Water Diver qualification. Well done to all the students involved. It was a fantastic day and an amazing experience and your determination to succeed made us very proud of all of you.

# Monday 29<sup>th</sup> February


We will be holding our next Parents' Community Group meeting on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> February at 6pm in the school library.
