Friday 1st - Sunday 3rd July 2016

Every year we take a group of students to the Yorkshire Dales to take part in the world famous Yorkshire 3 Peaks Challenge. This incredible trip gives students the opportunity to really push themselves against some of the toughest terrain in the UK, work effectively in a team and experience God's own county's finest views. We are running the expedition for Year 10 this year, the cost of which is £120 (there are subsidies available). Spaces are limited and we are asking students to submit a short letter of application stating how they would benefit from this experience. This letter should be addressed to Mr Richards and Mr Randall and be submitted before Wednesday 23rd March. We will contact all successful applicants after the Easter holiday. At this point we will provide the permission slip and details of payment.

The Yorkshire Three Peaks Challenge is a serious physical test that involves covering a marathon (26 miles) distance and over 5000ft of assent. Students need to be fit in order to take part. The training sessions are designed to prepare students for this challenge and they will take place on Wednesday and Friday mornings (7.45am) in the new gym.

We will be holding fitness tests in the run up to the event and, whilst we will put support packages in place for students who fail the first test, students who fail the final test will not be at an appropriate level of fitness to take part in the challenge and will be unable to attend. If your son/daughter has been attending the training sessions they will easily pass the fitness tests.

ITINERARY

We will be departing from school on the morning of Friday 1st July and returning to school at around 3pm on Sunday 3rd July.

We aim to arrive at our campsite in the Yorkshire Dales in the late afternoon. We will all have a fish and chip supper, set up camp and have a nice relaxed evening ready for the challenge ahead.

On Saturday morning, we will start the hike at around 8am. Our mountain leaders will meet us at a nearby café and we will aim to complete the 26 mile route in under 10 hours. Upon our return to camp, we will shower, change and head out to the local curry house. We will come home for an early bedtime. On the Sunday morning, we will wake up, pack up and leave.

We will provide breakfast, lunch, all energy snacks and drinks on the walk, a support vehicle for the event, all transport, pitch fees, mountain leaders (guides) and fish and chips and curry on the Saturday night.

HYGIENE PACKS FOR REFUGEES

Our Wednesday assembly last week was presented by visitors from Refugee Relief Slough, Maidenhead and Windsor. This charity works to support the refugees in Calais and Dunkirk.


They explained to the students what refugees were; why they had left their homes, how they had made their journeys and the appalling and unhygienic conditions where they are presently living.

The school would like to support this charity in their work to help the refugees in the camps in Calais and Dunkirk by making hygiene packs which are desperately needed. Keeping clean is a major challenge as there are few showers and most people get water from standpipes. The children saw some (appropriate) pictures of the conditions in the camps so they were able to appreciate the needs of the refugees and how they may be able to help.

The charity will supply a bag to every one of our students who would like to help by creating a hygiene pack. Of course, your support will be needed and very much appreciated.

THE CONTENTS OF EACH HYGIENE PACK NEED TO BE:

- A new toothbrush
- A tube of toothpaste
- A comb
- A roll-on deodorant
- A small pack of baby wipes
- A small bottle of hand sanitiser





The final item is optional but will add a personal and compassionate touch: it would be lovely for your child to write a small card, postcard or message to show support and encouragement to a refugee.

The charity's work is entirely humanitarian. It understands that not all families will want to support this initiative; some of you will already be involved, others may have political views which mean you can't support it.
