FURZE PLATT STUDENT WINS FOYLE YOUNG POETS OF THE YEAR AWARD



Jonathan Stone (Year 13) has been named as one of 15 winners of Foyle's national competition. Jonathan's poem 'Pbft' was one of over 12 thousand entries from almost 70 countries.

"Pfbt - pronounced as a sort of exasperated braying sigh - is about death and people's reactions to it, broadly speaking. The first thing to come to me was the image of a silently-deflated balloon, and how anticlimactic it is without a squeak, pop or anything else - I hit on the conceit of all the different endings of a balloon being like all the ways people die, and more specifically, the ways we're remembered." LIONHEART REGIONAL FINAL



On Friday 16th October eleven Year 10 students took part in the Lionheart Regional Final. These students were part of the winning team from the in-school competition held in June.

We made our way to Hackney Town Hall via public transport (due to a last minute minibus break-down) and despite arriving 30 minutes late (rush hour, London travelling!) the students got straight into the challenge, hitting the ground running.

Students were tasked with coming up with a 'Social Action Project which would deliver a ground-breaking impact for a chosen citizen group'. Their product/service was called the 'Parent Pass', a discount card which could be used by single parents to get discounts in certain stores and on certain products in Maidenhead town centre.

During the day students worked with industry experts to help them develop their concept and the marketing and financial aspects of their product/service. They worked with members of the Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM), CIMA qualified accountants and students from The Glasgow School of Art. They had access to real market research databases to help them to understand their market.

At the end of the day students had to present their ideas to a panel of judges. Olivia Webster and Gabrielle Ford represented the group for the presentation and confidently presented their concept to an audience of over 200 people. The presentation was clear, evidence of a fantastic team effort during the day with all members making some great contributions.

Students won the trophy for the 'Best Product Concept' on the day and although they didn't make it through to the National Final they did really well against some very tough competition.

The students were a pleasure to be with throughout the day and conducted themselves really well both on the (busy) journey to and from the event and also during the day itself.
