Parents who book up first will have the most flexibility. If you do not have easy access to the internet, please contact the school office who will be happy to add appointments on your behalf.



- Find placements related to their choice of career or university course to increase motivation
- Prepare for their personal statements, university applications or curriculum vitae

As it is the student's responsibility to find and arrange their own work experience placement, we will not vet or carry out any checks in relation to the placement provider and will not visit the placement provider, either before or during the placement. Parents and students must ensure that they are happy with the work experience arrangements.

YEAR 12 WORK EXPERIENCE

STEM EVENT AT FURZE PLATT



Over two days this week all our Year 10 students and a small group of Year 12

students took part in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths) event. The event was run by visitors from Adviza, the school's chosen careers service; STEM Now, an organisation that delivers STEM activities; and Jacobs, an international engineering group. Working in groups, students had to design and build a model of a footbridge across the M4. The purpose of the bridge was to join up green spaces on either side of the motorway, allowing easy access to these areas and so encourage outdoor activity. Students needed to consider factors such as location, cost, access, visual impact, environmental impact and social impact. Each student had a specific role within their group, and groups had to plan and design their bridge, select and cost appropriate materials (pieces of K'Nex) and build and test the bridge. They then had to present a pitch to the judges from Jacobs, who asked some tough questions.

During the activity students had the opportunity to meet and work with people from the world of work and to develop and use a variety of skills. In addition to STEM skills, students practised teamwork, planning, communication, finance, problem solving and presentation skills (and, for some of the Year 12 students, fierce competition and industrial espionage!).

Students enjoyed the activity and gained a lot from it. They all worked hard, and rose to the challenge of completing their bridges. They all participated in the presentations and impressed the judges. We would like to thank all our visitors who came in

to thank all our visitors who came in and made the event such a success.

New Recycling Initiative – Receive up to £2,000 for your school!
