IMPROVED DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP FACILITIES AT THE FRONT OF SCHOOL

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Many of you will have already seen the great work that has been done over the summer holiday to double the drop-off and pick-up lanes at the front of the school – with the intention of making it both quicker and safer to both drop and collect your sons and daughters.

The end of the school day can get particularly busy. In order to help keep all of our young people safe when leaving school please could we ask that all parents who collect their children via car to:

- avoid parking stopping on the double yellow lines at any time
- keep moving up towards the exit gate (Cranbrook Drive end) as far as you can (children have been instructed to wait for collection at the top end, near the exit gate)
- pull into one of the designated parking lanes if you are waiting
- turn your engines off while waiting in order to preserve air quality
- circulate back round onto the road, if there are no spaces in the parking lanes, in order to help keep things moving
- when traffic is built up at the traffic lights at the Furze Platt Road and Switchback junction, please consider turning left and travelling via Pinkneys Road.

Please can we also ask that parents refrain from entering the school gates at 3.15pm, unless meeting a member of staff. It is important to keep routes as clear as possible for our students to exit in an orderly manner.

However, while we now have improved vehicle collection facilities, we actively encourage as many of our students

as possible to either walk or cycle the short distance they need to travel to and from school. Doing so provides the triple benefit of reducing congestion on local roads, improving the health and fitness of your children and protecting the environment.

EMOTIONAL WELLBEING CHAMPIONS: SUPPORTING MENTAL HEALTH AT FURZE PLATT



The Emotional Wellbeing Champions are a team of students from across Years 7-13 who have volunteered their time to help the school raise awareness and tackle the stigma surrounding mental health. Last term the team delivered a series of assemblies to students to raise awareness of how we all have mental health and suggestions of how to support your own mental health.



This term we are launching our 'Worry Box' and 'Shelf Help' initiatives. The worry box is a new box located outside reception where students can discretely post their concerns. If a student had concerns or worries about either themselves or their friends they can confidentially write it down and post in the Worry Box. Staff will check the box weekly and provide appropriate support for anyone who has raised a concern.

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We have also set up a 'Shelf Help' section of the school library using funding kindly given by the PTFA. Shelf Help is a national library initiative of books providing advice and guidance on a range of mental health and emotional wellbeing topics such as anxiety, bullying and exam stress. All titles come from a nationally recommended reading list of 35 titles and are now available to borrow from the school library.

The Emotional Wellbeing Champions are committed to working to further support mental health and wellbeing at Furze Platt over the next academic year.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is the world's leading youth achievement award. It is a non- competitive programme of activities for anyone aged 14-24.

Participation in the D of E gives young people the opportunity to experience new activities or develop existing skills.

There are three progressive levels which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold award. The award is completed by choosing volunteering, physical and skills activities, going on an expedition, and for Gold only, taking part in a residential activity.

Volunteering- undertaking service to individuals or the community

Physical- improving an area of sport, dance or fitness activities

Skills- developing practical and social skills and personal interests

Expedition- planning, training for and completion of an adventurous journey in the UK or abroad

Residential- staying and working away from home during a shared activity

We will be running assemblies to students on Wednesday 25th September, explaining how the scheme works, and the benefits of taking part.

Prior to that, we would like to welcome you to a parents' information evening, on **Tuesday 17th September**, from 6pm in the Main Hall.


