YEAR 9 PARENTS' CONSULTATION EVENINGS



On Thursday 4th February (9F) and Thursday 11th February (9P) there will be a consultation evening for Year 9 parents. Due to the current social distancing measures in place this event will be held virtually.

To identify if your child is in F or P band please look at their timetable either in their planner or on Go4Schools [Year 7 students will be in F, P or S.]. You will notice underneath the subject and teacher name is a code, ie 9P/En3. This indicates the student is in Year 9, Band P. Appointment slots will be available to book from 6:00pm this evening for 9F and from 6.00pm on Wednesday 3rd February for 9P. We advise you to book as soon as possible as appointment are likely to book up quickly. Please note that one teacher will cover the three sciences (and will appear under Biology).

As you may be aware, this term Year 9 students will be choosing the subjects they wish to study for their GCSEs in Years 10 and 11. Due to the current situation, the process this year will be quite different to previous years.

Over the next four weeks, teachers will be delivering a taster lesson in their subjects remotely. This will give students a good idea what that subject is like when taken as a GCSE.

The parents' evenings on Thursday 4th and Thursday 11th February are fantastic opportunities to discuss GCSE courses your child may be considering with their teachers following the taster lessons as well as their progress in those subjects.

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
