On Tuesday 28th November we had a workshop with the fantastic Kerrie Frampton, Artistic Director of Splendid Theatre Company. Kerrie initially ran a 2 hour workshop with our Year 12 and 13 Drama

students on their set text, Yerma. The students explored design and directing focussing on character and style. Following this workshop, our two Year 10 groups had a two-hour workshop, each exploring Physical Theatre. They explored the use of lifts, falls and physical movement to communicate a story. It was an excellent opportunity for students to experience a different style of theatre and teaching and work with a professional in the industry.

PUPPETRY
