QUESTION TIME, MAIDENHEAD

I applied for tickets when I heard Question Time was coming to Maidenhead and was called last week to say I had been successful. We arrived at the Town Hall yesterday (Thursday 8th December) and were asked to write down a question that was topical and provocative.

David Dimbleby came out and put everyone at their ease by chatting about the format, how he would like people to address the panel (ie not to one person as he likes to get everyone to speak) and how the main questions were chosen. We then took our seats and had a warm up session, with members of the audience sitting in the main seats to check sound and lighting etc which was very amusing as they were assigned the characters of the forthcoming panel!

The panel were a very diverse group: Former Conservative MP Louise Mensch; Chair for the Commons Health Committee and Conservative MP Dr Sarah Wollaston; author and journalist Will Self; Labour Shadow Justice Secretary Richard Burgon; and former UKIP leader Nigel Farage.

Questions asked included:

- Is Donald Trump a worthy recipient of Time Magazine's 'Person of the Year'?
- Could a deal for Brexit be realistically achieved in two years?


Is Boris Johnson too much of a loose cannon to be Foreign Secretary?

Dear Parents & Carers,

This is a short but heartfelt plea to anyone reading this to assist with the running of the PTFA. At the last PTFA meeting there were 3 people present - myself, the treasurer and the secretary.

The (outdoor) Car Boot Sale, which ended when the leisure centre complex was being built/was completed, put a big dent in the potential funds coming into the PTFA but was proving difficult to maintain anyway as it required 10 volunteers once a month to step forward. In its place we've instigated the Indoor Table Top Sale – which is well supported in the wider community but is in danger of being abandoned due to lack of volunteer help to run it (5/6 people are needed 6 times a year). This event needs your help.

Refreshments are provided by the PTFA at various school events, but this also is in danger of not happening in the future as the stock replenishment is a job needing doing as well as the actual serving at the events (there's approximately 5 of these events a year).

You might think that PTA business finished when your children entered senior school but if it did then it wouldn't have been possible to fund a minibus purchase/minibus upkeep/sports colours/graduation gowns/musical instruments and much more.

So, I/we (all 3 of us) NEED you to step forward. There are 4 meetings a year and about 14 events of varying size to cover in a calendar year.



The government is currently consulting on its new education proposals. These include a proposal to return to selection at age 11 through the expansion of the grammar schools. Governors at Furze Platt are very concerned that the reintroduction of a grammar school in Maidenhead would have an impact on the strong comprehensive schools that serve the community currently. I am writing to advise you of an opportunity for your son/daughter to participate in an hour long Steel Pan Workshop that will take place during the school day on Monday 9th January. Year 8 will be studying World Music later in the school year and this workshop will give them the opportunity to experience playing in a Steel Pan band and an understanding of the context of Calypso music.
