
### SIXTH FORM OPEN EVENING

## STEEL PAN WORKSHOP

On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> February, over one hundred Year 8 students had the opportunity to experience playing steel pans as part of a Music Workshop. The day ran very smoothly and all students appeared to enjoy the experience. The following article was written by one of our students who attended the session.

"The Steel Pan Workshop was an amazing experience. We learnt how to play together as a group and also learnt some information about the steel pans. There were 3 types of pans and also a percussion group which included maracas, bells and box drums.



The instructor was really nice and took his time teaching us the different segments of the song as many of us had never played the steel pans before.

At the beginning we were put into different groups and taught the basics of the steel pans. The instructor taught us different parts in our groups. We all had to pay attention, as we all got to play all the different types of pans and one of the percussion instruments. By the end of the session we could play a song together with 3 parts. I enjoyed the experience as we really had to concentrate on the notes we had to play and at what time. It wasn't too difficult and it didn't really matter if you hit a wrong note as it was very loud with all of us playing. The sound at the end of the session was amazing and we all felt proud of the music we were making."

## SENIOR MATHS CHALLENGE

Well done to all our students who entered the Senior Maths Challenge. Forty students won Gold, Silver or Bronze awards in the competition which pitted our Year 12 and 13 students against other sixth formers nationally. Charlotte Gould won Best in Year 12 and John Conacher won Best in Year for Year 13 at Furze Platt.



Further to his result, as he finished in the top 1000 students nationally, John was also invited to participate in the British Mathematical Olympiad in December. He has recently received his mark and gained a Distinction, which is only given to the top 25% of Olympiad participants. Next year, John hopes to go on to study Maths at the University of Cambridge.



**YEAR 11 GCSE PREPARATION – PRE-PUBLIC EXAMS**

We are entering a very important time for Year 11s, as they prepare to excel in this summer's GCSE exams. Pre- Public Exams (PPEs) are a crucial part of that preparation – both testing students' progress across their different subjects and familiarising them with the rigours of exam papers and the environment of the exam hall. A programme of PPEs has been scheduled between September and March for Year 11. There will be further PPEs for English, Maths and Philosophy & Religion over the next few weeks.

**Key PPE Dates:**

- Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2018 – Maths PPE 3
- Friday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018 – English PPE 2
- Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2018 – Maths PPE 4
- Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2018 – English PPE 3
- Monday 26<sup>th</sup> March 2018 – Philosophy & Religion PPE 2

PPEs take place during the normal school day, and students will be expected to be in lessons if they do not have an exam. There is no 'study leave' for PPEs and students will be in school from 8.45am to 3.15pm as usual. However, when students have afternoon exams they will be permitted to leave after the exam finishes. Please note that, while some exams will finish before 3:15, there are some subjects that will not finish until after 3:30 (particularly where a student qualifies for extra time in their exams).

**ENGLISH REVISION PROGRAMME**

The English Department will be running Revision Sessions for Year 11 students, starting on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January. These sessions will cover GCSE revision for both the English Language and English Literature papers, including all set texts. This programme of revision has been put in place to help students manage their workload and alleviate exam pressure.

Students will be able to choose the areas of study they feel they would most benefit from extra revision. At present the sessions will be filled on a 'first come first served' basis, up to a maximum of 20 per class. However, after half term pre-booking will take place – more details to follow later.

All sessions will take place after school on Wednesdays from 3.15pm-4.15pm, starting on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2018. They will take place in the following classrooms:
