DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD INFORMATION



Your child will shortly be nearing the end of their three month section. When participants have completed the minimum time requirements and achieved their goals, the DofE requires a written report, which is a record of their progress. This is called an Assessor's Report, and it is mandatory in order to complete each section.

With this in mind, please access the Assessor Report pack in the link below, which gives information about how to approach the Assessor to complete the report. You will also see a link for the Expedition Information Pack, detailing the necessary information for the upcoming expedition.

Please note, that in order for your child to attend the expedition and ultimately complete their Duke of Edinburgh Award, the assessor's report for the three month sections must be submitted, and payment for the Award must be received in full.

If you have not already done so, please pay your outstanding balance on Box Office, which can be accessed via the school's website. BXM will shortly be invoicing us for the expedition, therefore we require full payment from you no later than Friday 9th March. If we have not received full payment by this date, unfortunately we cannot permit your child to attend the expedition.

I would be grateful if you could complete and the enclosed Medical Consent form as soon as possible. These can be handed into reception, and we require them no later than Friday 2nd March.



HEAD BOY AND HEAD GIRL ALUMNI SUCCESS

We were delighted to hear that our Head Boy and Head Girl from 2013 have both achieved Firsts from the University of Oxford.

Max Fishwick, who studied Engineering Science at Somerville College and Lisa Hibbitt, who studied Experimental Psychology at St Hilda's College, have been kind enough to answer some questions about their experience at school and university.



What did you most enjoy about school?

Making a great set of friends and studying subjects at A-Level that I was really interested in, particularly Psychology & Biology which went on to influence my degree choice.

What did you study at A levels and why?

Psychology, Geography, Biology & ICT

What is your greatest achievement at school/something you are most proud of?

Being Head Girl was a massive achievement, as I never believed it was something I'd be able to do - it helped so much with my self-confidence.

What did you enjoy most about being Head Girl?

I really enjoyed the responsibility and organisational aspect - I feel these skills really helped when applying to university.

What did you study at university and why did you choose Oxford?

Experimental Psychology, St Hilda's College, Oxford

What was the application/interview process like?

A benefit of applying to Oxbridge is the earlier UAC deadline - so you can just get it done and out of the way. There isn't

too much preparation you can for the entry exams, but you can find past papers online which will give you an idea of what to expect. The interview process can last 1-3 days, which gives you the opportunity to get to experience the city first hand. It is quite a challenging process, however, it definitely worth the effort of applying.

Do you have any advice that you think would help our current students?

Just try your best and enjoy the school experience.



What did you most enjoy about school?

Like most students, I enjoyed the social and sports parts of school more than the academics. With the exception of a few teachers who were particularly inspiring, I didn't really begin to enjoy the academic side until Sixth Form.

What did you study at A levels and why?

In Sixth Form I studied 4 A-levels (Maths, Further Maths, Physics and Chemistry) and an Extended Project qualification. I have always had a natural aptitude for Maths & Science and I much prefer working on projects that require a problem solving, analytical approach.

What is your greatest achievement at school / something you are most proud of?

One of my proudest moments at school was when I led Furze Platt to victory at the Berkshire Schools Army Day against 40 other schools in Year 10. It was a full day event, where a team of 20 of us completed a combination of head-to-head mental and physical team exercises.

What did you enjoy most about being Head Boy?

As Head Boy I felt that I was forced out of my comfort zone, to gain skills such as public speaking, team leadership and most importantly the confidence to voice my opinion in high-pressure situations. These skills have been invaluable in both my degree and my career.

What did you study at university and why did you choose Oxford? What was the application / interview process like?

I have always enjoyed working hard and expanding my knowledge, so it felt like the right step for me to go to university. I applied to go to Oxford mainly because of its reputation and the challenge that it represented, however I was very apprehensive about actually attending Oxford for 4 years. I cannot express how happy I am that I chose to go. Not only did I get to work alongside and learn from some of the finest minds in science, I also met an incredibly eclectic mix of people, many of whom will be friends for life, and that pushed me to become a much more confident and well-rounded person.

Looking back on the Oxbridge interview process, I'd be lying if I said that it wasn't stressful. Especially when you consider the lack of experience and preparation that we had compared to applicants that have attended a private school. However, if you prepare correctly and learn from someone who has been through the experience, you can considerably reduce the pressure. Once you know what to expect, I would actually consider it to be less stressful than a traditional job interview.

Did you do activities out of school that you feel helped you and if so, what were they?

Outside of school I did a lot of sport including rugby, swimming and fitness training. I also had guitar lessons for 8 years. I believe that having the opportunity to do activities that required me to apply myself to something more practical than school work, helped me to be more focused during my academic studies. Additionally, I used to tutor some of my classmates before exams, which helped a great deal in improving my understanding of the subjects.

Do you have any advice that you think would help our current students?

My general advice to those students who are considering applying to university, is that university isn't for everyone but I would suggest at least trying the first term to see if it might be for you. I had the best 4 years and I am so glad that I went.

For anyone considering applying to Oxford or Cambridge, they are fantastic universities with opportunities to excel in what ever interests you most but you have to be prepared for more pressure and more work than you would experience elsewhere.

Finally, you should really consider the subject that you are applying for. Some easy questions to ask yourself when you are choosing your subject are:

Would you choose to read around the subject in your free time?

What career path would allow you to enjoy your day-to-day work? Does the subject help you to get there or at least leave that path open?

YEAR 9 PRE-PUBLIC EXAMS

The Pre-Public Exams (PPEs) will take place from Monday 26th February to Friday 9th March. They take place during the normal school day. Unlike in Years 10 and 11, where PPEs run as formal exams in the Sports Hall, Year 9 PPEs will take place in their normal classrooms during normal lesson times.

The purpose of these exams is to start to familiarise students with the rigours of busy exam programmes and the structures of exam papers. The PPEs will also provide an initial assessment of where students are after the first 6 months of their GCSE studies.

Your son/daughter's teachers will tell them when their exams will be during the exam fortnight and will be providing them with specific information about what is going to be assessed in each of their exams.

Please may I ask you to work with your son/daughter to ensure that they prepare appropriately for these PPEs. They should be following a revision timetable and working steadily and sustainably towards the exams. While it may still seem in the distant future, these PPEs are an important part of the preparation for their final GCSE exams in Year 11

PPE results will be published with the main progress reports due out at the end of March.
