named from the ancient box woodland found on the steepest west-facing chalk slopes overlooking the River Mole. And I can hear you asking – what is a box woodland? No - it's not an Amazon box that you might get delivered! The common box is a large, slow-growing evergreen tree – hence the name box woodland.

Box Hill is a famous destination for day-trippers of all ages! As such, it has much to offer families, as well as ramblers, naturalists and cyclists. The scenes from the summit were stunningly calming and relaxing, especially on such a clear day.

On the summit, there is a café/servery and small gift shop. The Natural Play Trail provides engaging educational resources for visitors with stepping stones across streams and opportunities to explore and learn as they make their way through the woodlands. There are also guided walks to gain a better understanding of the area.

As part of our visit, we carried out surveys with the general public, questioning them on their mode of transport: likes and dislikes of the area and the potential risks. We also evaluated the impact of tourism on the area: amount of visible litter; how sounds of large groups impact the wildlife; vandalism and amount of trampling and erosion caused to designated walkways and to non-designated walkways. Luckily, Mr Fraser will be collating all the responses when we return!

At different hills, we conducted various experiments: observing the sward (grass) height; the percentage of bare ground; the percentage of long, short or medium sward and measuring how compact the ground was. You can probably picture us all crouching down with our rulers and measuring away. Other visitors were probably wandering what on earth was going on! But, I found the perfect piece of grass to make a 'grass whistle' and managed to make a screeching sound!

We have a number of important dates and events coming up after half term for Year 12 students, so please be aware of the following information:

Pre Public Exams (PPEs):

- **Monday 18th & Tuesday 19th June - Year 12 Art & Photography PPEs:** Students to attend school at normal time. The exam duration is 5 hours with 2 breaks, and students will finish school as normal at 3.15pm.
- **Monday 25th – Thursday 28th June- Year 12 PPE period:** During these 4 days, students will be on full exam/study leave and will not be expected to attend any school sessions (tutor time, assemblies, tutorials etc.) and will only be expected to attend their exams. All students must wear clothing that meets with the Sixth Form's dress code whilst at school during this week. All students have an individual timetable issued to them outlining the times of their exams. **Please note that the morning exams are due to start at 8.45am and students should arrive at 8.30am to be ready to start at 8.45am. Afternoon exams will start at 12.30pm and students should arrive at 12.15pm to be ready to start at 12.30pm.**

- **Friday 29th June - Year 12 Careers Day:** The day will consist of a variety of seminars and workshops that will assist students with planning for and developing skills for their future careers. Further details and information to follow shortly. All students must arrive at school promptly at 8.40am.

ICELAND FIELD TRIP - EASTER 2019

Wednesday 10th – Saturday 13th April 2019

The Geography Department at Furze Platt Senior School is well known for organising a range of excellent trips – both in terms of preparing students for examinations, and also offering an experience of a lifetime. In 2015 and 2017 we have taken students to Iceland during the Easter break. These trips have been exciting for the school and department and have proved to be a huge success.

We are excited to be offering another trip to Iceland during the Easter Break of 2019: 10th – 13th April. Although this trip will offer excellent support to the work that students cover in A Level and GCSE, this will be run as a purely optional trip giving Furze Platt students the chance, every two years, to experience the raw power of Geography in an environment very different to that of the UK! As we only plan to run the trip once every two years, this opportunity will be open to all students from Years 9 to 13 – although priority will be given to those students studying Geography in Years 12 and 13 to ensure that they get a chance to go before they leave school. Based on the success of previous trips, we expect this to be a very popular trip. Quotes have been requested based on 40 students and 4 staff so it is likely that a 'Reserve List' will be created in the event of over-subscription.
