


YEAR 12 PSYCHOLOGY EXPERIMENTS

This week our Year 12 Psychology students had a chance to put their knowledge into practice and conduct an experiment of their choice. Some ambitious projects involved replicating Moscovici's study into conformity based on colour recognition, and checking the effect of sugary drinks, such as Coke, on human performance. Interesting conclusions were drawn, for example, twins Sophia and Eleanor Smith were comparing the effectiveness of using black or coloured print text in memorizing. They proved that in fact students memorised more when the text was printed in black. This questions the effectiveness of using coloured pens or highlighters, which would make an interesting further investigation. We hope to see more independent research done in the future.

YOUNG FIREFIGHTERS, MAIDENHEAD FIRE STATION

My role at the school is to develop curriculum opportunities which are in addition to our usual academic and extra curricular programme. Much of my work involves small groups of students exploring social, personal and emotional issues, but I also look for fun activities which give students opportunities to experience something new, unusual or socially worthwhile both in, and outside of the school environment.

I am writing to inform you about the Young Firefighters scheme, based at Maidenhead's fire station. The scheme is for young people aged 11- 17 and it offers them a chance to work in a team and develop life skills through taking part in fire and rescue service based training activities. These activities are supervised by qualified fire fighters and nonoperational fire and rescue staff. The fire fighters scheme will give them the opportunity to work towards a nationally recognised qualification which will reflect their achievements on the scheme.

Young Firefighters meet every Thursday night, during term time, between 7 - 9pm, starting on Thursday 13th September. Your child will be required to contribute £2 per week, which will go towards refreshments, Christmas parties and trips.

There are limited spaces on these schemes therefore, you are required to complete an application form in order for the fire service to determine whether your child is suitable. Once this form has been submitted, the application will be considered and you will be informed directly whether your child has a place on the programme.

scheme, as well as an information leaflet.

I would be grateful if you could ensure that these forms are completed and returned to school as soon as possible, to enable the process to begin.

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
