The vast majority of our uniform remains the same as at present. However, we have made the following minor changes:

- Our uniform guidelines are no longer gender specific.
 This is in common with many schools who have moved to 'gender neutral' uniforms.
- Responding to student and parental comments we have introduced school shorts for those who wish to wear them. These should be the same style as current trousers; plain black, straight leg, and smartly tailored to the knee.
- We have removed any colour requirement on coats.
 We would encourage you to purchase a warm, weatherproof coat that allows students to be visible on their journey to and from school.






BISHAM HOUSE ARE OUR END OF TERM WINNERS




