For the past 6 weeks, Year 9 Drama students have been rehearsing after school for our production of 'The Accordion Shop'. It is set on 'The Road', a typical street in an unnamed town where we meet the boys and girls, wholly likeable teenagers, who welcome you to the show's setting in our story. To the local residents, The Road is perhaps what West Drive is to school. A place to hang out, a place where most things happen and most importantly – somewhere we all know.



The Road, in our performance, is where the story takes place. It is left in utter disarray after groups of teenagers swarmed down the road in such a frenzy all because they received a text...this ended in disaster though as it reflected a riot.

Our play shows local residents processing what this riot meant, both for the community and the structure of our society overall. Who was to blame? Who caused this mess? Most importantly, was blame the right response, to a devastation, caused by mass confusion?



FURZE PLATT STUDENTS COMPETE AT READING UNIVERSITY SCIENCE **CHALLENGE 2019**



A team of Furze Platt's finest went off to Reading University to compete against the cream of schools from the South East on Friday. FPSS had made their debut under the fine tutelage of Mr. Molin in 2008 and had enjoyed winning the competition a few years ago.



An open invitation encouraged keen scientists and mathematicians to show interest and a shortlist of sixteen had been compiled which needed to be whittled down to eight members to form the two teams. The 'squad' did a great peer selection job, with the only stipulation from me being that the public face of FPSS at Reading were 'mixed' teams. We ended up with two balanced squads. Team 'Castor' was led by Patrick Kelly and supported by Connor Soden, Bella Powell and Ellie Gavin. Team 'Pollux' was led by Ashrath Kumar and supported by Felix Earl, Maddison Menelaus and Katie Pettigrew.

The competition is based on the long running and very popular TV quiz - 'University Challenge'. The twelve teams on the day would complete a 'round-robin' with the four highest scoring teams at the end of the morning session going through to the semi-finals. We arrived in good time

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and got stuck in. Both teams enjoyed success during the course of the morning but narrowly missed the top four places. The published results showing Castor missing a semi-final berth by just five points!






REQUEST FROM PSYCHOLOGY



If your account balance is over £5 you may either request a refund, have the money transferred to a younger sibling, or donate the balance to the school.




