YEARS 9 AND 10 'PREPARING TO SUCCEED' EVENING



This is at the Oxford Playhouse on Thursday 7th November, tickets will cost £6.50.

GEOGRAPHY TRIP - BOX HILL



'Thinking outside the Box Hill' by Tom Lonsdale, Year 11

In the first few weeks of term, Furze Platt's Year 11 students, myself included, participated in a Field trip in which all the Geography students visited Box Hill. Box Hill is a National trust area in Surrey, approximately 30 kilometres south west of London.

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This trip was in preparation for our GCSE Geography paper 3, which is fieldwork based. Our task was to answer our given hypothesis: 'Is Box Hill a sustainable community? '

On Wednesday the 18th September, it was my turn to visit. After an early 7.15am departure things were a little subdued to begin with, but after a 90 minute journey enthusiasm among the students improved.

We started straight away, meeting up with a representative of Box Hill who waited eagerly for our arrival. A welcoming introduction and a small warm up task later, we began the main part of our research, some surveys which we had to complete ourselves as well as asking members of the public for their opinions on the designated area.

One of our many activities was paying a visit to one of Box Hill's many breathtaking viewpoints. The sight of miles upon miles of countryside was extremely impressive.



Next, one of the volunteers lead us to another viewpoint, where we saw the cycling track that was used for the 2012 Olympics. After a quick lunch break and completing our surveys, we then went on a walk into the village just outside Box Hill. There, we observed the area's range of shops as well as deciding how sustainable it was, judging its social, economic and environmental factors. We were also asked to draw a quick sketch of the village hall, which was one of our stops on the walk. While none of us had the artistic skills of Van Gogh, it was a fun task none the less.

Once we had finished the walk, the coach was waiting for us, ready to take us home. In no time, we were back at school and we were ready to head home.

Overall it was a very fascinating trip and let's hope the experience we gained from it can improve our final GCSE grades!
