### **2020 REVISION CENSUS**



Dear Parent/Carer,

Over the next couple of weeks, Furze Platt is taking part in the 2020 Revision Census. This is a major piece of scientific research designed to measure how effectively school students are learning in their own time, in particular when revising for tests and exams.

Your child will be asked to complete a 10-minute online survey during Year 10 and Year 11 PSHE lessons or Sixth Form tutor time, which will include questions about:

- How they study and revise currently
- What they understand about effective ways to revise
- · Their attitudes towards doing well in exams
- Demographic data such as their year group and ethnicity

No questions are compulsory, although we do encourage students to engage with the questionnaire as fully as possible, as a useful opportunity for your child to reflect on their approach to their studies today.

The responses from Furze Platt students will be combined with responses from 50+ other participating schools around the country in what is expected to be the largest study of its kind ever undertaken, and will be used for two primary purposes:

Advancing scientific understanding: the researchers intend to publish findings on the extent to which school students are using effective learning techniques, and what might be done to help accelerate the adoption of more effective revision techniques.

Furze Platt will receive average results for our own students, which we will use to inform efforts to improve the quality of independent learning among our students, helping them to achieve their potential in exams.

Dear Sixth Form Parents,

I would like to introduce myself as the School's Apprenticeship Champion for Sixth Form. Within my role I hope to provide both Year 13 and Year 12 with the skills, knowledge and confidence to seek out school leaver employment/apprenticeship opportunities and to ensure they are successful in applying for an apprenticeship or school leaver employment with ongoing training - if this is their chosen pathway.

"Do something today that your future self will thank you for."

With an ever-changing job market, providing careers advice can be a real challenge. A survey from the National

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Apprenticeship Service found that 87% of parents give career advice to their children, but as many as 90% don't feel equipped to give it in the first place. The top three sectors that people still associate with apprenticeships are construction, electrical, and plumbing – but in truth, there are many, many more apprenticeship opportunities available nowadays.

As the Sixth Form's Apprenticeship Champion, I will help both your son / daughter and yourself to better understand higher level apprenticeships and the tremendous opportunities they can offer school leavers. Students planning to apply for an apprenticeship scheme will be given a personalised plan, sessions on core skills required to apply, confidence building workshops and one to one mentoring sessions with myself to assist them in making the right choices. All students need to do is drop me an email and I will book them in for an introductory session.

I will also be making available a whole host of useful resources which both you and your son or daughter will be able to access and refer to via the Sixth Form section of FP-Online, these resources will include things such as FAQ's, useful weblinks and general advice and guidance. 

### **HOUSE CHALLENGE**






Our new House Challenge this term will be for each House to collect as much for Food Share as possible.

### Outreach Team Worker in Shine

Salary scale – 5. Actual salary range £15,900 To £17,500

The Shine Unit at Furze Platt Senior School helps young people with autism thrive and succeed in a mainstream school environment. The Outreach Team working within Shine provides support and training to students, their teachers and parents within the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead mainstream education settings.

We are looking for someone to join the outreach team and work with both teaching and support staff at a range of mainstream schools in order to support them with meeting the needs of Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 4 pupils with autism. This involves whole school, whole class and individual pupil work ensuring that standards of attainment are raised and that pupils are successfully included and succeed in a mainstream school setting.

Specialist training would be provided early on to enable you to manage a caseload of pupils with a diagnosis of autism. You would work with schools providing them with the skills, understanding and competencies to enable them to maintain and embed practice across the whole school for all pupils with autism. You would also support parents of pupils with autism and create and maintain materials required to deliver student programmes as well as attend multiagency meetings to provide advice and support as appropriate.

We are looking for a good communicator with previous experience of working with students with autism or Special Educational Needs perhaps as a Learning Support Assistant in a school or other educational environment. A willingness to embrace the specialist training and acquire a good knowledge and understanding of students with autism is key as well as the ability to manage students in a classroom setting, prioritise workload, and work as part of a team. Use of a car is essential to enable you to visit RBWM schools.
