# Facts about Frank Bruno

British boxers of a Caribbean background have played a prominent role in the national boxing scene since the early 1980's. In 1995 Frank Bruno, who's mother was a Pentecostal lav preacher from Jamaica, became British first world heavyweight boxing champion in the 20th century.

Bruno grew up in Wandsworth, South West London. Growing up with five brothers and sisters in a terraced house, Bruno's mother was Jamaican and his father was Dominican. Bruno got into many street fights during his youth and he began to box seriously while at Oak Hall Reform School in Sussex.

He was also known for his exceptional punching power, scoring 38 knockouts in 40 wins and giving him a 95% knockout-to-win ratio; his overall knockout percentage was 84.44%. Bruno has remained a popular celebrity with the British public following his retirement from boxing, including his well-documented struggles with mental health.
