



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VIRTUAL BAKING CLUB Remote Festive Baking Fork Biscuits and Rudolf Round

Normally at this time of year, we would be running a Christmas baking club. However, this year - with the help of two talented Year 7 students - we have made a video to show you how to make Fork Biscuits or a Rudolf Round. Why not give it a go? Get your ingredients ready, use the recipe and watch the video to show you what to do and get cooking! Take a photo and send it to sarah.crisford@furzeplatt.net

It is the most delightful video, running to just over seven minutes, and will certainly get you in the mood for some Christmas cookery!

In addition to our wonderful student stars of the show, thank you to Mrs Crisford (Head of Food and Nutrition) and Miss Chetwood (Design and Marketing Officer) who created, filmed and edited the video.

RECIPE for FORK BISCUITS or a RUDOLF ROUND

Ingredients for the biscuit dough (Makes 16 fork biscuits or a Rudolf round)

150g Self-Raising Flour 100g Butter 50g Caster Sugar



To decorate the Rudolf round: 1 tablespoon icing sugar. 1 teaspoon water

Pretzels Smarties or something for the Rudolf nose

Equipment

Two baking trays, weighing scales, mixing bowl, wooden spoon, fork.


Method

- Preheat your oven to Fan 160c or Gas 4.
- Line your baking trays with greaseproof paper.
- Place your butter into a large mixing bowl.
- Using your wooden spoon, beat until soft and pale in colour.
- Gradually beat your sugar into your butter, the add in your flour a spoon at a time.
- Press the mixture against the edge of the bowl to combine, and finally use your hands to combine into a ball of biscuit dough.
- For the fork biscuits:
- Divide the mixture in half, and roll into two long sausages about 3cm in diameter.
- Cut each one into 8 pieces.
- Roll each piece into a ball, and place onto the greaseproof paper on the baking tray. Using a fork flatten the biscuits.
- Using oven gloves place in preheated oven for 10-15 minutes until golden.
- Remove from oven using oven gloves and place the tray on cooling rack.
- For the Rudolf round:
- Use a rolling pin to roll your dough into a disc, about 1.5 cm in height.
- Place onto the baking tray.
- Gently, using a knife score the round (you only want to cut 2/3mm deep) to give 8 even sized pieces.
- Place in the oven for 18 20 minutes or until just golden brown.
- Place on a cooling rack and leave to cool before decorating.
- Use a serrated knife cut the round on the score lines.
- To decorate:
- Make the icing by mixing 1 tablespoon of icing sugar, mixed with a teaspoon of water.
- Use the icing to stick on the pretzel antlers, eyes and Rudolf's red nose.



Rordman Fir

- A lovely rich green colour.
- Our most popular choice, due to its long soft needles and excellent needle retention.
- The 'Stubbings' Nordman is usually very bushy so not always ideal to fit in tight spaces.

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Roble Fir

- Blue/green colour.
- Long soft needles and excellent needle retention.
- Generally narrower and more layered in style than the popular Nordman, providing plenty of space for baubles, tinsel and other decorations.

Traser Tir

- A lovely green colour with silver sheen under needle with fantastic balsam
- Shorter, rounder needles and excellent to good needle retention.
- Bushler than Noble, but narrower than the other Fir varieties, a very popular choice for the modern home.

Lodgepole Pine

- Dark green colour.
- Long needles in a classic pine shape with good needle retention. Bushy and generally wider than Firs.
- The largest range of cut and pot grown Christmas trees

Blue Spruce

- Blue/green colour. Medium thin (and sharp) need so gloves are required, with medium needle retention.
- A stunning Christmas tree, most beautiful when the eedles are bluish in colour

PREPARATION - Make sure you unwrap your tree outside and bang firmly on the ground to remove any debris and loose needles before bringing into your home.

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A FRESH CUT - Make sure you take a fresh cut off the base of the trunk (at least 1 inch) before bringing the tree indoors. We can cut this for you if required.

WATER, WATER, WATER -Your tree stand should have a water reservoir. You'll be amazed how much a tree will drink in the first weeks indoors. Keep watering but note that the tree will drink less and less as the season progr

CHRISTMAS TREE CARE

STANDS - Alongside the ability to provide sufficient water, you should also check your stand is suitable for the size of tree you wish to buy. Ensuring you have a solid stand is especially important if you have young children or pets.

NEEDLE DROP - As a fresh product, grown outdoors, trees will inevitably drop needles, the extent of which will depend on many factors.

AVOID TOO MUCH HEAT - Don't forget that Christmas Trees ar grown outside. Radiators are their worst enemy so if possible turn off (or down) any radiators in close proximity to your tree.
