#### **Online Schooling**

#### **Covid Testing**

This week saw us conduct the first round of testing of students and staff who are onsite at FPSS, using the Lateral Flow Device. All results have so far been negative. From now until our return we will be testing our Keyworker and Vulnerable students, as well as staff, each Monday. We are expecting to be asked to expand our testing programme when students return and will send consent forms and details to all parents and carers once a return date is confirmed.

#### **2021 Exams Consultation**

On Wednesday there were letters exchanged between Gavin Williamson, Secretary of State for Education, and Simon Lebus, Head of Ofqual, outlining the parameters for the system by which grades will be awarded this summer. We are expecting some consultation documents out imminently and I will contact Year 11 and 13 students, parents and carers when more is known.
