MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Students, Parents and Carers,



Water Safety Talks

Thank you to Neil Whiteman from Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service who delivered talks to every year group on Tuesday. Neil was able to share statistics on the numbers of young people who had died in water accidents (for example, forty-eight 15-24 year olds last year), highlight the specific dangers



of cold water shock, weirs, tombstoning (jumping from high points like bridges into water) and the seaside, as well as sharing what to do in an emergency. His overall message was to enjoy the summer and water, but do so safely. A message that following recent tragic events we would all endorse.

IT SYSTEMS FOR SEPTEMBER INCLUDING HOME LEARNING ON GO 4 SCHOOLS

From September 2021 all home learning will be set on Go 4 Schools rather than Show My Homework. The school has been using Go 4 Schools for a number of years to report attendance, progress and behaviour to parents and by moving home learning into Go 4 Schools parents and students will have fewer platforms to log into.

In addition students and parents can see all Go 4 Schools information including home learning, attendance, progress and behaviour via the Go 4 Schools app which is

available for free from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.

To login to the GO 4 Schools App, your username and password are the same as the GO 4 Schools site.

In addition, in the new academic year FP Online is being replaced with FP Cloud, a Microsoft SharePoint powered intranet site for students and teachers to share work and resources connected to Microsoft Teams. Further information will be provided on this new platform to students and parents shortly.

ENRICHMENT DAYS (YEARS 7 AND 8)






This week we have had the pleasure of seeing our Year 7 and 8 students engaging in some fantastic activities for our Enrichment Days (Years 9 and 10 are next week).


Message from the Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme:

Despite the challenges we all faced during the 'Covid year' of 20/21, we were proud to support such a high level of DofE activity generated by the amazing 3,781 organisations and 40,000+ volunteers who continued to run DofE. Through organisations like yours, 180,000 young people across the UK started their DofE, including 40,000 from disadvantaged backgrounds. During the year, a staggering 330,000 participants developed their skills, confidence and resilience by doing their DofE and dedicated 1.8 million hours of volunteering during the pandemic.

Operationally, the charity shifted to support our network virtually; delivering development meetings, workshops, conferences, parent information sessions and training courses online. We developed programme flexibilities so that Leaders and participants could, and still can, engage with their DofE while limitations to daily life remain. These programme flexibilities will be in place until December 2022 and your Operations Officer will continue to work with your DofE Manager to ensure your organisation's delivery can continue to thrive.

Throughout the year, we continued to recognise the achievements of participants who could not access their expeditions because of Covid with 62,000 young people gaining their Certificate of Achievement nationally. A further 45,000 participants completed their full Awards, partly enabled by the temporary expedition flexibilities we introduced so that expeditions are safely delivered and achieved under restrictions.

Recently, we have been celebrating the remarkable legacy of our Founder and Patron HRH Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh as we mark his centenary. His passing in April brought sadness and reflection, but it has also been truly uplifting to hear how the DofE is valued by so many people through the messages and personal stories shared with us, posted on our Memories page and shared in media interviews. Our recently launched strategy 'Youth Without Limits' will build on the Duke of Edinburgh's legacy by expanding our reach to more young people, in particular those who are most marginalised in our society. Our ambition is to give a million more young people the lifechanging opportunity of doing DofE in the next five years.

WILDSL6



Is your child interested in helping the local environment? Gaining a new skill? Learning about biodiversity, a key part of the national curriculum?

If so, at the beginning of the new school year, late September and early October 2021, we have a lovely, local environmental group 'WildSL6' coming into school to help turn an empty patch of grass into a wildflower meadow. This will hopefully become a permanent wildflower habitat with yearly flowers. This activity will help the school work towards its goal of achieving the Ecoschools Green Flag Award.



WildSL6 is an environmental group for young people in the SL6 area who care about our local wildlife and want to help conserve their habitats. They are a relatively new group, who formed during the COVID-19 pandemic in summer 2020. The group

has already run various events including nature walks, wildlife surveys and online conservation campaigns.

The workshops will be held on Tuesdays after school for 3 -4 weeks from the 28th Sept to 19th Oct (dates TBC). During the sessions pupils will have the opportunity to learn about how to prepare the soil, how to sow and care for seeds, as well as learning about the many benefits of wildflower meadows.

Career Opportunity at Hewland Engineering



WINK - PERFORMING ARTS


