Virtual Work Experience at Heathrow Airport

Heathrow Airport is running a free week-long Virtual Work Experience programme in July for students in Years 11, 12 and 13. The school has been offered 25 places on the programme. The programme runs from Monday 12th to Friday 16th July 2021 and covers areas such as construction, engineering, marketing, IT and business at the airport. It is a fully-online experience using videos, quizzes and activities, enabling students to learn about the airport and bring to life their studies with real-world industry examples. Overall there are around 10 hours of content for students, who can complete the programme to fit around their schedule.

During the week, students will also have access to a number of live webinars with colleagues from across Heathrow including senior directors and apprentices who will give students an insight into their career and answer any questions.

BOOK REVIEW BY TOM HARRISON, YEAR 7




HARRY POTTER AND THE PHILOSOPHER'S STONE

CAREERS IN PROPERTY - WEBINAR ON THURSDAY 6th MAY

Over the coming weeks Pathways to Property will be hosting a webinar that is free to attend and is suitable for any student, parent or teacher looking to find out more about careers in property. This will provide a specific case study with a property firm joining us for the session.

Webinar 2: An Industry talk with SEGRO

Taking place on Thursday 6th May from 5pm – 5.45pm, this webinar will be hosted by property firm SEGRO, one of the leading owner-manager and developer of industrial properties. This is great chance to learn more about the property industry by hearing first hand from the people who work in SEGRO about the career paths you can explore. SEGRO will also be presenting on a key topic in the industrial sector – data centres – and why they are so important to everyday life. There is so much more to property than the buying and selling of houses, and SEGRO is a great example of how diverse an industry it is.

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Year 9 Vaccinations this summer term 2021 This summer term the Berkshire Immunisation Team will be visiting all students in year 9 and offering 3 vaccines during the same session, which include:

- · Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio (3 in 1 booster)
- Meningitis ACWY
- HPV dose 2 (for students who have received dose 1 at least 6 month prior)

It is estimated that the human body contains enough white blood cells to cope with thousands of vaccines at any one time. If a child was given 11 vaccines at once, it would only use about a thousandth of the immune system. It is not a good idea to delay vaccinations to 'spread the load', because it leaves the child unprotected against serious diseases for longer.

Due to the covid-19 pandemic we are still catching up on missed vaccines and completing our routine schedule which is why we are offering the 3 vaccines together this year.




