#### **End of School Pick Up**



#### TRIBUTE TO JORDAN VEIRA

The Furze Platt Senior School community are deeply saddened to learn of the death of one of our students, Jordan Veira. Our thoughts are with his friends and family at this sad time.

Jordan was a pleasure to have as one of our Furze Platt Senior School students. He was often humorous and entertained many of his peers and staff. Anna Bradley, his tutor, fondly remembers how "Jordan approached everything with a relaxed and chilled out attitude. He was a popular boy who was a very loyal friend to many. He filled the room with a charming wit and sense of fun."

In conversation, Jordan exuded vibrancy and energy. His eyes sparkled as he engaged with students or staff whether in educational discussion or was simply having a laugh. He had an incredibly warm character to which staff and his peers responded with genuine affection.

Our school community mourn for a young man who has died far too young. Jordan had so much yet to offer. We intend to hold memorial events over the forthcoming days and weeks so we can remember Jordan. Our pastoral staff and counsellors will be supporting staff and students as they come to terms with the news.

Above everything else, our community is thinking of Jordan's family and friends. We send them every condolence at this sad time.



# WINNER OF BBC 2 AWARDS 'ICONS – GREATEST PERSON OF THE 20TH CENTURY'

Mathematician Alan Turing worked on intercepting coded messages during World War 2 and invented a machine to crack the German Enigma code, which led to the Allies winning the war against Nazi Germany in 1945.

However, in 1952, Turing was convicted for having a homosexual relationship and underwent chemical castration, taking his own life at just 41 years of age.

He was eventually pardoned in 2013, which led to new legislation pardoning all gay men under historical gross indecency laws.

His life can be seen in the film 'The Imitation Game' starring Benedict Cumberbatch (on Netflix and Amazon Prime).

#### RUGBY WORLD RECORD HOLDER FOR THE MOST TEST MATCHES REFEREED

Nigel Owens, MBE (age 49) is a Welsh former international rugby union referee, who retired after a 17 year career in 2020. As well as holding the world record for the most test matches refereed, he is also one of five professional international referees within the Welsh Rugby Union.

He has said about his sexuality: 'It's such a big taboo to be gay in my line of work, I had to think very hard about it because I didn't want to jeopardise my career. Coming out was very difficult and I tried to live with who I really was for years. I knew I was 'different' from my late teens, but I was just living a lie.'
