to see the recent statement in the Maidenhead Advertiser from Jordan's family looking for "meaningful change" over water safety at a time when they are grieving so deeply.

Only this week I was witness to scores of teenagers jumping off Sonning Bridge into the River, completely oblivious to any form of water safety.

As an RYA instructor myself at Maidenhead Sailing Club I am all too aware of both the fun that can be had on water but also the surrounding dangers that one has to be aware of.

As a community it is vital that we support this call from Jordan's family to educate our children over the dangers of the river and if one or more lives can be saved by doing so it will be a fitting tribute to Jordan.

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#### **ENRICHMENT AFTERNOONS**

One of the aspects of school that has been much missed over the last year has been our clubs and societies.

Due to Covid restrictions these have been limited as schools have focused on classroom learning. However, they are a vital part of the school experience and help make FPSS special. They offer students the opportunity to explore interests, try something new, as well as meet new people and build strong bonds with their peers and staff. #### **Virtual Work Experience at Heathrow Airport**

Heathrow Airport is running a free week-long Virtual Work Experience programme in July for students in Years 11, 12 and 13. The school has been offered 25 places on the programme. The programme runs from Monday 12<sup>th</sup> to Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021 and covers areas such as construction, engineering, marketing, IT and business at the airport. It is a fully-online experience using videos, quizzes and activities, enabling students to learn about the airport and bring to life their studies with real-world industry examples. Overall there are around 10 hours of content which can be fitted around other commitments.

During the week, students will also have access to a number of live webinars with colleagues from across Heathrow including senior directors and apprentices who will give students an insight into their career and answer any questions.

#### FREDDIE MERCURY - PERFORMER

Born Frederick Bulsara in Zanzibar in 1946, Freddie Mercury (as he is better known) was the lead singer of the band Queen, formed in 1970. With a four octave range and a flamboyant stage presence, both Mercury and the band are probably best known for their show stopping performance at Live Aid in 1985 in front of 72,000 people at Wembley and millions more around the world, raising a staggering \$127 million for charity. Widely thought to be bisexual, he contracted HIV and died at just 45.



## MARSHA P JOHNSON - LEGENDARY GAY RIGHTS ACTIVIST

Marsha P. Johnson (born and also known as Malcolm Michaels Jr) founded the first Gay Liberation Front which led to a number of other groups. Known for advocating gay rights and for being a well-known activist and a self-identified drag queen, Johnson also modelled for the famous artist Andy Warhol.




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#### **GILBERT BAKER - DESIGNED RAINBOW FLAG**



Gilbert Baker. American artist and gay rights activist, is best known for his design of the rainbow flag in 1978 which has become a symbol of LGBT rights. Refusing to trademark the design by saying it was for everyone, he created what was at the time the world's largest flag to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall riots.

- 8. Add any additional notes/information for the attendance team. Please provide as much information as possible regarding this absence for our records.
- 9. Click 'Submit'
