Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

#### Term 1

#### SUPERVISED STUDY CLUB




Would your child like a quiet space to work? Do they need support with their home learning?

#### YEAR 11 - REVISION CONFERENCE



Year 11 students attended a session delivered by our Senior Leadership Team on Tuesday focusing on revision and how to make the process successful. This included looking at Understanding the Effective Learning Process including:-

- ✓ Understanding
- ✓ Condensing
- ✓ Memorising
- ✓ Reviewing/revisiting what is memorised
- ✓ Application to question & Practising
- ✓ Using effective note taking to help understanding
- ✓ RAGGING (Red, Amber, Green: traffic lighting topics within a subject to indicate where knowledge is sound, requires some work, requires learning)
- ✓ Planning effective revision tasks

They did various activities including RAGGING a subject and making and consolidating notes from extracts used in English Literature.

Immediately following October half term, all of Year 11 will be attending a session on producing an effective revision timetable during their PSHE lessons. This will then be followed by a session on 'How to Revise' later on in the year to build on the skills gained from this week's session.

So far I have thoroughly enjoyed my experience with the Duke of Edinburgh award, after doing my Bronze Award practice expedition camping in Hurley - We walked all the way from Hambleden to Hurley, camped overnight, then walked all the way back to Maidenhead. It greatly improved some of my skills, such as using my camping gear, setting up a tent, cooking food, and even my overall resilience and teamwork skills.
