Dear Parents / Carers

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year

Thank you for all your support since September. As a community we have made considerable efforts to make students' experiences closer to how we would want them to be following recent disrupted years. Daily, we are now running a range of learning activities,



lessons and extra-curricular opportunities in keeping with our ACHIEVE values.

In Terms 1 and 2 these have included over 50 clubs and activities, sporting fixtures, Duke of Edinburgh expeditions, theatre trips, geography fieldwork and our recent Christmas Concert. Running through these events and more has been our House competitions which once again have brought fun to learning and a sense of identity within FPSS. I would like to express my gratitude to our staff and governors who, despite various uncertainties, have been focused on ensuring our students have the best possible education. Our Year 11 and 13 students are adapting to the reality of examinations next year, as well as planning their futures with the help of PSHE lessons, tutor activities and our Careers and Higher Education Fair. Similarly, each university application that is submitted is marked with the ringing of a bell and applause by our Sixth Form students and staff.

I would like to thank all our students, parents and carers for their part in securing this outcome, along with their ongoing support for FPSS.



FURZE PLATT VISIT FROM FORMER PRIME MINISTER

On 26th November 2021, Mrs Theresa May MP visited Furze Platt Senior School and held a seminar for our Year 12 Politics students. We were delighted to have this opportunity again, following on from a very successful Microsoft Teams session in 2020. Ronia Royce (Politics



Prefect) writes:

"I wasn't expecting to be able to have such an open conversation with Mrs May. There were no restrictions on the questions that we could ask and it meant that the whole session was very transparent. Prior to the lesson, our politics class had done some research into Mrs May's background and I was excited to be able to ask her about her thoughts on the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill, which is going through Parliament right now. I was also able to ask her about why she was a member of the Conservative Party, and although I disagreed with her answer she listened to my opinion and answered my follow up questions. It was a really good opportunity to be able to speak directly to a former Conservative Prime Minister and I found her to be really insightful. I enjoyed hearing about her involvement with the environment and the plans she had to reach net zero in the UK. She even expressed her concerns over crypto currencies too."

The students completed excellent research into Mrs May's background, were attentive and were model students throughout the session.

COVID TESTS



Dear Parent/Carer

Thank you for your continued engagement in the Covid-19 testing programme and for encouraging your children to self-test at home. If your child needs another test kit box to use over the holidays, they can collect one from student reception/sixth form reception or you can collect one from your local pharmacy.

The government have advised that students in secondary schools should be offered one onsite Covid test on their return to school after the holidays. At FPSS this will be on their first day back, Tuesday 4th January. After testing at school, students will be given a box of test kits to continue testing at home in the Spring term.

If you have already given consent for your child to participate in the onsite testing, you do not need to do so again. However, if you have not yet given consent, please do so by following this link:

COVID CONSENT FORM

If you are not sure whether you have previously given consent, please do so again. A separate consent is required for each child.

Whilst asymptomatic covid testing in school is not mandatory, we encourage your child to take part as this is the most effective way to reduce the risk of transmission and support the continuation of face-to-face education.


