


MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF GOVERNORS



Firstly and most importantly a happy new year from governors to all our Furze Platt community.

We hope that you had an enjoyable festive season and that we can all look forward to 2022 and a much needed eventual return to normality.



You will have heard the result of the recent Ofsted inspection and I would encourage you to read a copy of the report and see the many positive comments that were made about the school. This is a credit to the whole school community for all the ongoing hard work that is undertaken. There is no doubt that the Ofsted bar has been raised in terms of expectations so a 'Good' rating (with many outstanding features) is something we should all be proud of and gives us a solid base on which to build for the future.

I see an Ofsted visit as a useful external 'barometer' of the ongoing effectiveness of the school, it is a deep dive for a short period of time but those leading the school should know our strengths and weaknesses far better. It is the responsibility of the leadership team from an operational perspective and governors from a strategic one to ensure that we keep striving to improve every aspect of school life. We are on a continuing journey and need to make sure that we are doing the best with the resources we have available.

One aspect of School life that has been on the radar for many years now is the IT side of things. How do we embrace technology to ensure that our students learning is as effective as possible and they are best equipped for their eventual workplace? For the last 18 months or so a strategic working group has been looking at the feasibility of introducing a parental laptop scheme for our students. I can announce that after rigorous debate of the pros and cons (as many governors are current parents) it has been agreed to push ahead with the roll out of this from the start of the new academic year (September 2022) for Years 7 and 10. Details and full information will be made available in due course so that parents can plan ahead and budget accordingly. It is however imperative that no student will be excluded or prohibited from participating for financial reasons.

In other news we were delighted at our December full governing body meeting to appoint Nabeela Akhtar as a new governor and are looking forward to working with her.
