## FURZE PLATT SENIOR SCHOOL

#### **MESSAGE FROM YEAR 9 DOFE STUDENTS**

"We are a group of young people in Year 9, and we're doing our Duke of Edinburgh volunteering section together. Last term we were thinking about what to do to volunteer, and we chose to help homeless people because we wanted to help those in need. We helped homeless and vulnerable people get the help and resources they needed by organising a collection in

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school. We collected items, before sorting them and giving them to Slough Outreach to distribute. It felt really good to get people the resources they need. We enjoyed the process and it felt good to help people feel safe. We collected 25 toothbrushes, 100 toothpastes, assorted toiletries, 13 hats, 8 blankets, 32 soup sachets, 23 cans of food, snacks and drinks, 5 coats, 16 socks and other warm items of clothing. From these we supplied homeless people with gift bags and over 60 of these were given out on Sunday 19th December. It was great to know we made a difference and to know that homeless people could also get a better Christmas. We are very grateful to everyone who helped and made a donation for our community. Thank you to everyone who helped us to make an impact."
