## YEAR 12 A LEVEL ENGLISH TRIP TO HAMLET, GLOBE THEATRE

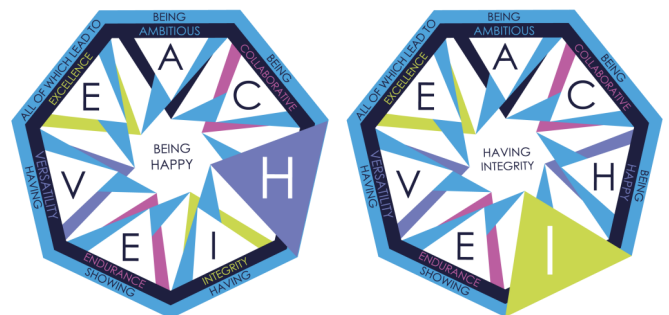

## YEAR 11 GCSE FRENCH, GERMAN, SPANISH SPEAKING EXAMS:

27<sup>TH</sup> APRIL – 13<sup>TH</sup> MAY

All Year 11 students studying GCSE French, German or Spanish will complete their GCSE speaking exam during the examination period 27th April – 13th May.

Class teachers have notified students of the time frame during which their GCSE speaking exam will take place and their Speaking exam time will be confirmed by the beginning of next term.

The GCSE Speaking exam is 25% of the final grade and so it is crucial that students revise and practise in preparation for this. Class teachers have continued to support students with this component of the course and will also update GO Home Learning with specific details / resources for students to refer to during the Easter break.

Students should also continue to revise regularly in preparation for their other GCSE French, German or Spanish exams (Listening, Reading, Writing). All students have a GCSE revision workbook enabling them to practise and complete a variety of exam style questions covering all topics and grammar from the course. Students also have access to online vocabulary exercises via their class Quizlet and other online language learning resources shared by their class teacher.

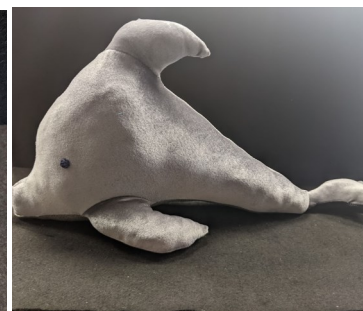


## YEAR 10 AND 12 TEXTILES, ART AND FASHION

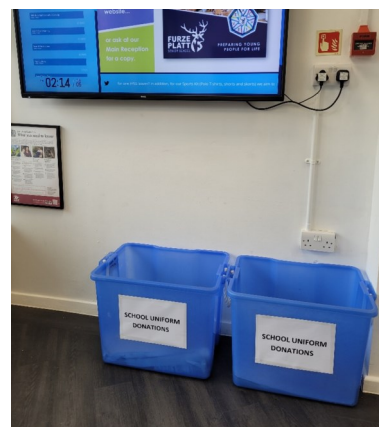

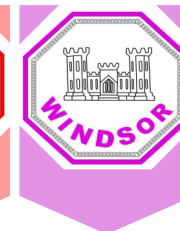
